Dear Luther Memorial,

Alleluia! Christ is Risen!

We celebrated a little earlier than we usually do this year, but the celebration is just as glorious! But now we turn our eyes from the empty tomb to our lives in the Resurrection Dawn. And it is always the case that this Second Sunday of Easter (April 7) we hear the story of Thomas. Thomas the Twin. Didymus. But more often we hear of him as Doubting Thomas. However you remember him and his story, we encounter him every year on the second Sunday in the great Week of Weeks that is our Easter celebration.

And yes, we can focus a lot on Thomas. But every year I am more struck by the story of the other ten disciples and the community of believers that were gathered in that upper room. You see, while we can have a conversation about why this particular text is read *every* year on the same Sunday, I firmly believe there's a reason. It's not just because Thomas misses Sunday morning and so a week later Jesus comes to him (though that *is* the case in the story). Rather, I think it focuses us as the community that continues to gather in Jesus name about what it means to live on this side of the Resurrection.

You see, it's less about whether Thomas believed the first time and more to do with Thomas continuing to belong and be welcomed into the community even when he misses out. Thomas doesn't see what the rest of them see. Thomas has a hard time believing. Thomas just isn't sure it's possible. But for a week Thomas is still held in and by the community. Thomas is still there a week later when Jesus reappears.

For us who continue to gather in Jesus' name and who hold the stories of faith and witness that we have been given, this is a fabulous model for us in the world. The Church, I firmly believe, is called to continue in this tradition of the 10 disciples and the community of Jesus who held Thomas with his questions and doubts for a whole week. We are called to be a community that proclaims the good news of God at work in Jesus, yes. But all the more, we are called to be a community that continues to hold space for people to wrestle and wonder and doubt. A community where together we come to experience God's love for a broken world. A community where we can be honest with ourselves and with one another and know that we are all held in the wounded hands of Jesus.

We let ourselves off the hook when we only focus on Thomas. Doubting Thomas, we call him as if he's the only one to struggle. How quickly we forget that **no one** believes it the first time. Heck! This year we heard of the women leaving the tomb in fear! It's not about Thomas' doubt, but about the community that continues to gather in the name of the Crucified-Risen One and holds one another in a common hope.

Christ is risen, indeed! Alleluia!






Holy Trinity Dinners
