KEEPING ADVENT

The word *advent* means *coming*. During these four short weeks in the Christian year, we

watch and wait for the signs of Christ's coming among us now and in the future, even as we prepare to celebrate his advent as an infant at Bethlehem. The full significance of the Advent season often gets lost in frenzied preparations for December 25. Here are some suggestions for keeping Advent as the season it was meant to be.

Use Advent to help find your way in a culture in which many have lost theirs. Wait awhile to put up your decorations, and keep them simple. Shop local. Purchase cards or gifts from groups that help others. Send a donation to the ELCA Hunger Appeal, Bethany Outreach Center, or other nonprofit in honor of someone who has everything. Live so that those who have lost their way might know the gift of God's love in Christ Jesus.

Use Advent's four weeks to engage in activities that can clear your mind, simplify your life, and nourish your faith. Put four blue candles (or any other color) on a table. During the day or evening, light one candle for each week in Advent. Read one of the scripture passages from the previous Sunday's worship, pray the prayers in that Sunday's bulletin, and add your own prayers. Read a devotional book. Come to worship on each of the four Sundays to meet Christ as he comes to you in word, water, bread and wine.

Use Advent to receive the One who comes to earth's people and who works through us today. Give a gift to a person or family whose budget is stretched then. Send cards to those who are ill, alone, or grieving. Volunteer with one of the organizations helping others in the days before Christmas. Take hats, gloves, and scarves to Holy Trinity, Trinity Center, or Bethany Outreach to keep children and adults warm. Let Christ's love reach others through you.

Dare to be counter-cultural this Advent. Create some new traditions. Look for the signs of Christ's coming in your life and in the world.

Moving Forward



Can we move forward? Should we yet? How?

No one is 100% sure how or where this SARS-CoV-2 virus started. What we do know is that it has been devastating to so many people. If you're feeling caught in limbo, you're in good company. It's highly unlikely that the U.S., or the world, will be able to completely eliminate the coronavirus that causes Covid-19. But I'm

pretty sure that many people also thought that about the polio virus. But it was eradicated when the vaccine was developed and administered to millions of people. Scientists are confident that there will come a day when Covid-19 is no longer a pandemic. As of now there is not a measurement to determine when something is an epidemic or pandemic according to Dr Arnold Monto, a professor of epidemiology at the University of Michigan. Covid-19 does remind scientists of most of the respiratory viruses that eventually start behaving as seasonal events, but when this will happen, we don't know. Dr Monto states we have to "wait and see and hold our breath" to unlock what an endemic phase might look like." An endemic phase means that a disease has a constant presence in a population – but does not have an alarming effect on large amounts of people. We have done pretty well with wearing masks, self-distancing, hand washing and vaccines. We all have our own personal opinions about many things and the vaccine is no different. I just hope that if you have questions that you research reliable scientific knowledge and talk with your physician. I also encourage you to ask God in prayer to help you make the best decision for yourself and your loved ones.

So do we move forward? First and foremost we need to depend on our faith in God to bring us out of this pandemic and move us forward. We can't go back to the lives we had before the pandemic. There are still many unknowns – Will there be another wave? Will we bounce back financially? What if we have to quarantine again? Will we ever feel safe? All of this sounds overwhelming and depressing. Author, Suleika Jaouad, and many other cancer survivors, including myself, liken this to a cancer diagnosis. Everything gets turned upside down. Your life is interrupted and your dreams are put on indefinite hold. She also stated that "there is no instruction manual for picking up the pieces, no map with directions on how to move forward." I must disagree with her. Our Holy Bible has many stories of how people came out of very difficult situations successfully. We need to read these stories to regain hope and resiliency to move forward. Suleika also states "The truth is that the ends of things are harder to pinpoint then beginnings and we want to think that there is a neat endpoint. We have to learn to move forward with them and carry what lingers."

Suleika shared three steps that can help you come to terms with what's happened and move forward:

- 1. Reckon with the impact of what we've all been through;
- 2. Allow yourself the space to reimagine what your life is going to look like moving forward, because none of us can return to the person we were or to the lives we had pre-pandemic;
- 3. Identify what we want to carry forward with us from this experience.

I would like to add a fourth step:

4. Prayer. Having our faith life interrupted has been very difficult for us. We are blessed to know that we don't need a phone or computer to get the help we need. God is with us always and is listening to our prayers and cries for help. And we must not forget to thank Him for all of our blessings.

I want to share a prayer from Nicki Koziarz who writes for the Proverbs 31 organization. *God, thank You that we can say* "From this point forward, it will be different." Thank You for the strength within us to move our words to a place of blessing no matter what the situation. Help us to get there today. Guide our words. Let what's deep within be challenged so that what flows from us is good. In Jesus' Name, Amen.

Despite the many awful things that have happened during this pandemic, I feel that mental health awareness has come to the forefront, and this is so needed in our world today!

I also want to remind you about the Blue Christmas Service on Wednesday, December 8. We have had many changes and losses in the past two years and these may have caused us to feel grief. Please join us for this beautiful uplifting service showing God's love for us all.
