## Let's Re-visit RSV



In 2018 I wrote an article about RSV, respiratory syncytial virus. Who knew at that time that in 2022-2023 scientists, healthcare and researchers would be concerned with a "tripledemic"? They became concerned about Covid, the flu and RSV's rising incidences hitting early and hard. The only explanation from doctors for RSV starting unseasonably early is because children were shielded from common infections during the Covid-19

lockdown. The incidence of RSV circulation starts in the fall and peaks in the winter. This is the same as the flu and now Covid. This is all the more reason to be aware of these communicable diseases.

How serious is RSV? It is a respiratory virus that can affect people of all ages. In older children and adults it causes mostly upper respiratory infection symptoms (colds) but it can be serious for infants, older adults and anyone with underlying medical conditions.

How is it spread?

- It is in droplets in the air spread by an infected person by coughing and sneezing.
- Direct contact, such as kissing the face of a child who has RSV or if you have it and don't know. This is why parents have become protective of people touching and kissing their babies.
- Touching objects or surfaces with the virus on it, then touching your mouth, nose or eyes before washing or sanitizing your hands.
- People who have RSV are usually contagious for 3-8 days. But, sometimes infants and people with weakened immune systems can continue to spread the virus as long as 4 weeks.
- How can we protect ourselves? These recommendations are more familiar than in 2018.
  - Covering coughs and sneezes. Wear a mask if desired.
  - Hand washing and using hand sanitizers
  - Avoid contact with ill people
  - Avoid sharing eating and drinking utensils.
  - Keep infants <1 year (especially <6 months) away from people with upper respiratory infections. Being overprotective may be necessary.
  - Staying home when we are ill is important.

What are the symptoms?

- Runny nose
- Decrease in appetite
- Coughing, sneezing
- Fever low grade <101 degrees

Serious symptoms are:

- Difficulty breathing and wheezing
- Fever >103 degrees
- Difficulty drinking, swallowing
- Lethargy or irritability

These symptoms usually appear in stages and not all at once. In very young infants their only symptoms may be irritability, decreased activity and trouble breathing.

What are the risk factors?

- Age infants under 6 months (especially if premature) OR adults > 65 years, especially if diabetic, coronary heart disease, lung disease, weakened immune systems and diabetes
- Crowded places with unknown infected people
- Exposure to other children at daycare or school
- Smoking Don't smoke around infants and children. Babies exposed to tobacco smoke have an increased risk of getting RSV with potentially severe symptoms.

When to call the Doctor?

• Call when any of the symptoms get worse or a trip to the ER is needed. If you're concerned call 911 for an ambulance. You will be seen quicker than if you walk in.

#### Let's Re-visit RSV, cont'd .:

How is RSV diagnosed?

- A good medical history and physical exam is necessary for a diagnosis.
- Oxygen saturation
- Lab testing of nasal fluid
- Chest x-ray to check for pneumonia
- Blood tests to check for bacterial infection and dehydration
- If very ill, blood and urine cultures may need to be done.

Mild RSV usually requires no specific treatment and, if the symptoms are mild, can be treated at home. For infants and children only give OTC drugs under the recommendation of your healthcare provider. Severe infections may need supplemental oxygen, hydration/IV fluids and supportive medications like steroids. When I wrote the original article my research showed that RSV was the 2<sup>nd</sup> leading cause of death in infants. Now it's not even in the top 5!! I couldn't find current statistics for RSV being a cause of death in adults. So between better healthcare and awareness, we are making improvements in diagnosing, and treating RSV. So I hope this article has increased your knowledge and awareness to this virus called RSV, which we hear so much about.
