



WORD - "God speaks to us in Scripture reading, preaching and song."

The visionary message presented in this reading focuses on a future day when God establishes a universal reign of peace. Divine decisions will make war obsolete, and the worshiping community responds: "Let us walk in the light of that Lord now!"

Γ Jesus said to the disciples, ³⁶ About that day and hour no one knows, neither the angels of heaven, nor the Son, but only the Father. ^{37For} as the days of Noah were, so will be the coming of the Son-of-Man. ³⁸For as in the days before the flood they were eating and drinking, marrying and giving in marriage, until the day Noah entered the ark, ³⁹ and they knew nothing until the flood came and swept them all away, so, too, will be the coming of the Son-of-Man. 40Then two men will be in the field; one will be taken, and one will be left. ⁴¹Two women will be grinding meal together; one will be taken, and one will be left. ⁴²Keep awake, therefore, for you do not know on what day your Lord is coming. ⁴³But understand this: if the owner of the house had known in what part of the night the thief was coming, the owner would have stayed awake and would not have let the house be broken into. ⁴⁴Therefore you also must be ready, for the Son-of-Man is coming at an hour you do not expect."



This cup is the new covenant in my blood, shed for you and for all people for the forgiveness of sin.



If you are not going to receive Holy Communion, but would like to receive a blessing, please come forward with your arms crossed over your chest.


This text is from the pen of an English clergyman who, in addition to serving several congregations during his life, edited and published three books of hymnody, of which one was an influential work.


