Dear Luther Memorial,

Alleluia! God has gone up with the shout!
The Lord with the sound of the ram's horn! Alleluia!

This month our greeting changes a little bit. We still revel in the Resurrection Dawn—Easter is the Great Week of Weeks after all—but we also celebrate one of the big feasts of the Church Year: The Ascension of Jesus. Forty days after the Resurrection, we are told, Jesus physically ascended into the heavens. There are plenty of sermons to be preached on why Jesus needed to physically leave his followers but I'll leave those for another year—or for Bishop Lozano who will be preaching for our worship this year. What I want to focus on is Jesus' feet.

His feet? I'm sure you ask. Yes his feet. There are myriad depictions of the Ascension. Indeed, our own beloved tapestry is of just this moment in Jesus' life. And the first place we usually look in these depictions is to Jesus, to his hands of blessing, perhaps to the clouds or even to the disciples. But I think we often fail to look at the ground Jesus is leaving.

My favorite depictions of the Ascension are ones wherein the artist remembered to leave Jesus' footprints on the ground he left. You see, the last thing those disciples saw as Jesus left them was the bottom of his feet. And even being God Incarnate, those feet would have been dirty from the ground he had been walking on, and the scars of the nails were still visible we're told. And then, when everything was said and done, I can't help but imagine that the disciples looked down at the ground, perhaps after looking at one another. And there they would have seen Jesus' footprints.


You see, the stories we tell of our Risen Savior are not just stories of a ghost or a myth but of God Incarnate who actually walked this earth and taught us how to move through life in love for one another and for all. It *still* has an impact. The imprints are still left in this world of this Love of God known in Jesus. And in that we are called to live and move and find our being. What a reason to still be celebrating!

We encourage you to be sure that all gifts that you make to the capital fund are over and above your regular giving. The worst thing we could do in this regard would be to reduce regular support of our mission by diverting existing giving into the capital fund. To facilitate this, we are making special envelopes available for your capital fund giving. For the next three years, you will find special yellow envelopes in the pews that you can use for your parking lot project support. We appreciate your using these special envelopes and keeping your capital fund gifts separate from your regular worship envelopes. We would request that you write separate checks for your capital fund gift and that you not include your capital fund gifts in your regular offering checks. In addition, it would be helpful if you would indicate on your check that the gift goes to the capital fund. The same would be true if you make your offering by electronic means or any other alternative method. If you care to take some of the yellow envelopes home for future giving to the capital fund, feel free to do so or contact the church office and ask for a supply. Also, you are welcome to use any envelope you choose to either mail in your gifts or place them in the offering plate at worship. Did You Hit Your Head?



The spring and summer seasons are ahead and that means people, especially children, are involved in more activities. Unfortunately this also may mean that they can be involved in accidents which may involve hitting their head causing a concussion. This article is important not only for families with children involved in sports or just being active, but also for any adult. A concussion can happen to anyone.

A concussion is a type of brain injury-or TBI- caused by a bump, blow, or jolt to the head or body that causes your head to move rapidly back and forth resulting in your brain moving back and forth inside the skull. This sudden movement can cause the brain to bounce around or twist in the skull, creating chemical changes in your brain. Sometimes it can even stretch and damage the brain cells.

They are sometimes referred to as a "mild" brain injury. It is important to realize that when they occur they may not be life threatening, but they are still serious.

Concussions are usually thought of as only sports related. Other causes include bumping your head in a fall, being violently shaken (shaken baby syndrome), car accidents, or even sustaining a fall during dance class or gymnastics. This happened to the granddaughter of my friend. She fell in dance class and hit her head. It took 3 years of seeing many doctors and all kinds of treatments till her parents found the UPMC Sports Medicine Concussion Program in Pittsburgh. She has completed the treatment program there and finally feels her normal self after many years of misery.

It is recommended that if your child plays sports, dance or gymnastics that they have the IMPACT Baseline Concussion Testing. This test can be done locally and many schools/coaches are having their players take this testing. But, I'm not sure about gymnastics, and dancing. Cheerleading programs are now recommending this testing. Talk to their instructors and your family doctor about this testing, as it would be advantageous to your child's brain heath.

Symptoms of concussion don't always start right away. They may take days or weeks after the injury to become evident. The symptoms may include, but are not limited to:

- Headaches
- Nausea and or vomiting
- Bothered by light or noise
- Dizziness, balance problems
- Feeling sluggish, hazy, foggy or groggy
- Concentration problems/ memory loss

The recommendation used to be-don't let the person sleep. Now sleep and rest are good for brain healing. Waking the person every 2-3 hours initially is important to check their awareness and level of consciousness. Physical activities or activities that involve concentration, studying, computers/phones/tablets, television, and video games should be avoided. Doing these things may make the symptoms come back or get worse. Many students who have sustained a concussion may have to miss some school time and even return on a limited schedule.

As a parent you should be aware of the signs and symptoms and proper treatment for concussions. Too many people shrug it off as just a "stunner or a knock to the head". My grandson has had many concussions and he had to give up a scholarship for soccer. He started playing football at a young age and then switched to soccer. At 25 he continues to have some long term effects.

As an adult or adult caregiver to an elderly person, be aware of the increase incidence of falls and possibility of the occurrence of concussions. They may say they are "fine" and don't even realize they hit their head, so they should be watched.

For many years the long term effects of repeated concussions were not known, or were ignored. Now people who have experienced repeated hits to the head, concussions, and traumatic brain injuries may end up with CTE – Chronic Traumatic Encephalopathy. This may lead to mental health conditions, especially depression and thoughts of suicide. Several college and professional athletes have sadly taken their life by suicide. But the research is advancing quickly and some athletes are donating their brains for research. Other conditions that may occur are Parkinson's disease, dementia or other neurologic conditions. There is a movement among retired pro-athletes to prohibit children from starting to play

contact sports at younger ages. I heard one retired football player say he was prohibiting his grandson from playing contact sports till he was 16 when the brain is more fully developed. There are also recommendations to not lead with your head and play "heads up ball". I also have heard that they are limiting the "headers" in soccer in young children. Teaching safe playing to young athletes will save their brains. Also, tell you child no matter what sport they play they need to <u>immediately</u> report to the coach or instructors any type of hit to the head. This all sounds so scary but with prevention and early treatment the results will not be as serious.

I know we are all looking forward to a beautiful Erie summer and I hope it will be a safe and wonderful summer for you and your families.





April 2023 Council Meeting





- Pastor's Report After traveling twice to Philadelphia and back, Pastor Jay is now permanently in Erie. Youth ideas were discussed. The Installation service is scheduled for Saturday, June 24, 2023 at 9:30am. Upon motion from Skip Meyn, seconded by Pat Young, it was unanimous that a Pastor's Discretionary Fund be established using offerings from the Installation service.
- Property Committee Once the required signatures are obtained for the Easement Agreement, the lighting on 10th Street will resume. Paperwork for the parking lot is in order. A company from Ohio, PennOhio, is handling Lindy's commercial parking lot. No set date as of yet; possibly in May.
- Capital Fundraising Project and Status Some did not receive the mailing. One more Temple Talk is scheduled for Sunday, April 16. A gift of \$50,000 from an estate has been given toward the project.
- Organ Lighting Update Samples of various lighting choices are coming from China and we are awaiting the shipments.
- Safety Committee Update Two people per service will be checking in with Mitch or Caiden each Sunday to see if they need assistance. There is the potential for teacher and staff to have key fobs for the doors to school hallways. As the greenspace is developed, cameras for that area will be discussed. At the last school board meeting there was discussion of reviewing their safety plans.
- 7. Fellowship Hall Rental Two requests have been made to rent the fellowship hall for events. The Waiver Agreement from past years is in need of updating. On motion, it was unanimous that the request made by teachers to rent the space would be at a cost of \$15/hour. On motion, it was unanimous that a cost of \$100/hour, with a minimum rental time of four (4) hours, would be charged to non-members of Luther Memorial.
