Dear Luther Memorial,

It's the end of the world as we know it...

One of the changes that came to our keeping of time in the Church with the *Evangelical Lutheran Worship* resources is a resurrection of the period of time in the church year known as "End Times." This season is basically the month of November. In this time which begins with the keeping of the Feaster of All the Saints and the Feast of the Majesty of Christ, we hear some famous stories and some less famous stories. Whether they lay comfortably in our ear or perk our ears to new words, they have a marked shift in theme from the other readings in the Season after the Pentecost. In this month of readings, beginning with All Saints' Day, the focus is less on how to be Church now and more about looking to the return of Christ. It is logical, then, that this period of time concludes with the celebration of Christ's Reign.

In this time in the Church we hear stories like the Ten Bridesmaids in Matthew, or the "mini apocalypses" in Luke and Mark. We hear about "one will be taken and one will be left," and "the Human One will come on the clouds." This is the season when we join our voices with all creation and plead, "Come, Lord Jesus...and quickly!"

You see, this season as the society around us launches into harvest-time and Thanksgiving preparation, as the end of colored leaves and pumpkin patches fade, as the last of the apples have fallen, as the hibernation we experience in the Northern Hemisphere closes in with longer nights and darker days, the reminder is rather to stand and look to the coming of Christ.

Sounds like Advent, yeah? Sounds like themes we share in the lead-up to Christmas. It is not surprising, then, that we find Advent was once a much fuller season. Advent was once a season that lasted from the Sunday after All Saints' Day through Christmas Day. It was most often seven weeks. The time to look to the coming of Christ as both Savior and Sovereign of Creation and as the baby born as a Palestinian refugee in Bethlehem flows very seamlessly together.

In this season, let us look to the coming of Christ. But let us not look to the skies. In so doing, we may miss Christ is already among us in our neighbors. Because the joy of End Times and of its related Advent is that we celebrate the One who is coming and who has already come and who has always been. And for his presence and our call to be the Body of Christ in the world, thanks be to God.

"A Requiem in Context"

Commemoration of the Faithful Departed

Every year on the first Sunday in November we gather together to celebrate the Feast of All Saints. The feast itself is November 1. We give thanks for all those who have gone before us and have shaped our lives of faith. Particularly, in many contexts, we give thanks for those "big names" among the faithful whose names and deeds have come down to us through the generations. We often think about those whose names we put "Saint" in front of. In the Lutheran context, we often include in our celebrations on this day those who have died in the past year remembering and celebrating that through baptism we all are numbered among the saints.

That being said, there is an even longer tradition held in many parts of the Church and throughout the world of celebrating <u>all</u> those we have known who have died—this year and throughout time. This celebration is known commonly as All Souls' Day and is held on November 2, one day after All Saints' Day. It is, formally, the Commemoration of the Faithful Departed.

This year, in collaboration with the Luther Memorial Concert and Cultural Series and the Mercyhurst Concert Choir, we will celebrate All Souls Day with a Requiem Mass in the evening on Sunday, November 2. We will gather not just to hear a beautiful setting of the Requiem Mass composed by Faure, but also to share in a full Mass—with communion and all. We are considering this "A Requiem in Context."

We hope you will join us **Sunday**, **November 2 at 4:00pm** for this special service.

Our Neighbors' Place



Our Neighbors' Place is a seasonal overflow shelter that ensures everyone has a warm, safe place to sleep during Erie's winter season.

A community effort, ONP used to operate on a rotating basis among several downtown Erie churches during the winter season. This season ONP will take place at the Community Resilience Center, a single site location provided by Erie County. Guests are provided food, the opportunity to shower, a place to sleep, chaplain services, hygiene necessities, foot care, and are introduced to available homeless services.

Where and When:

- Community Resilience Center (450 E 16th St. Erie, PA 16503)
- This program is seasonal and will open in November 2025 April 2026.
- Every night from 7:00pm until 6:45am the next morning.

Who We Serve:

Any homeless man or woman without shelter.

How We Serve:

- Providing a warm overnight space to sleep.
- Supplying one meal to each guest.
- Connection to chaplain services.
- Giving guests an opportunity to shower.
- Bringing in community partners to provide foot care.
- Connection to other homeless resources in Erie County.

How You Can Help:

Luther Memorial Church will be volunteering at ONP the week of Wednesday, February 11 - Tuesday, February 17. Your help is needed for 1 night, 2 nights, or as many as you are able. Volunteers hand out towels for showers, offer coffee, hand out meals, provide t-shirts and socks for those that are in need of these items. Meals are pre-made and ready to serve.

It may seem as though February is long time away, but it comes quickly. Six volunteers are needed for each evening so we ask that you really give some thought to helping. Confirmation Class Revamp! - 11:30am

For students 7th grade through 9th grade, there will be four workshops offered throughout the year on the 2nd Sunday (in odd months: **November 9, January 11, March 8, May 10**) after the 10:30am worship service. In order to successfully complete confirmation classes, each confirmand must attend all four. However, the *same four* will be offered every year in slightly different orders to allow for flexibility in attending all four. There will also be a worship leadership and a biblical literacy component that will need to be completed along with the usual service hours. Finally, ConfirCamp is strongly recommended for *at least* or






Thanksgiving Feast




