St. Matthew's Lutheran Church Foundation

Luther Memorial Church Council was recently informed, from the former St. Matthew's congregation, that assets will be transferred to Luther Memorial Church for the legacy of St. Matthew's. It has been decided that a majority of the money will be restricted for the purpose of supporting ministry in the Erie community, and a portion will be transferred to the Luther Memorial Church endowment. The allocation is as follows:

Total St. Matthew's Lutheran Church Endowment (Restricted) \$416,975 Funds to Luther Memorial Church Endowment (Unrestricted) \$102,354 Total Assets \$519,329

The St. Matthew's Lutheran Church Endowment (Restricted) will have a committee of five people managing the distribution of the funds and they will make their recommendations to church council. The committee will determine the best ways to help others in the community, and as a result, to continue the legacy of St. Matthew's Lutheran Church. Three former members of St. Matthew's Lutheran Church and two members of Luther Memorial Church will serve on the committee, and their names will be shared with the congregation when finalized.

Vaccines and You



Most of us think that immunizations pertain mostly to children and young adults. But, there are important immunizations that adults should also consider receiving. Just the other day someone asked me "is it too early to get a flu shot?" They had heard it only protects you for three (3) months. Of course, I researched it and a local Infectious Disease Physician reports that it should protect you during the whole flu season. Even healthy adults can become seriously ill and can pass certain illnesses onto others. Immunizations are especially

important for adults 60 years of age and older, and for those who have a chronic condition such as asthma, COPD, diabetes or heart disease. Immunizations are also important for anyone who is in close contact with the very young, the very old, people with weakened immune systems and those who cannot be vaccinated.

This information was taken from the National Public Health Information Coalition Website and they recommend that all adults should get the following vaccines:

- Influenza (flu) vaccine each year to protect against seasonal flu;
- Td or Tdap- These protect against whooping cough (pertussis). Every adult should get a Tdap (tetanus, diphtheria, pertussis) vaccine once if they didn't receive it as an adolescent. Then they should receive a Td (tetanus, diphtheria) booster shot every 10 years. In addition they recommend that each time a woman is pregnant they should receive a Tdap vaccine, preferably at 27 through 36 weeks. We are hearing more about the Tdap vaccine because of the increase in whooping cough in the last few years. The vaccine received as a child doesn't last into adulthood. And for many of us older adults, we never received the vaccine as a child;
- The CDC recommends that all adults 65 years and older should receive the vaccine for pneumonia. There are two (2) types available now and you should discuss with your health care provider which one is appropriate for you.

The need for other adult vaccines such as shingles, hepatitis, HPV depends on one's age, occupation, travel health status and other risk factors.

Many people ask me if I have received the "shingles shot". I did receive the "old" shingles shot and now a new series of two (2) shots is recommended. I do need to do this series. Then they ask if I think they should get it. I cannot determine that for them, but here are recommendations and information about receiving the shingles vaccine:

- The NPHIC recommends the shingle vaccine for adults 60 years and older;
- Shingles occurs when the latent varicella zoster (chickenpox) virus is re-activated later in life;
- Pain from the shingles lesions, called post-herpatic neuralgia can be very severe and can last a year or more. The new vaccine series has more protection for the complication of post-herpatic neuralgia;
- Fifty percent of people who live until age 85 will develop shingles;
- In people 60 years and older, the new shingles vaccine reduces the risk of shingles by 90% and the effectiveness lasts above 85% for at least the first four years. It also reduces the risk of post herpatic neuralgia by 67%. So, yes, you can still get shingles after you have had the vaccine, but it shouldn't be as severe. Also, you can get shingles more than once.

Vaccines are thoroughly tested before licensing and carefully monitored even after they're licensed to ensure their safety. Side effects from vaccines are usually minor and temporary. Some people may have allergic reactions to certain vaccines, but serious and long-term effects are rare. Complications from a disease such as shingles can be serious. Hearing problems and vision loss are two potential complications from having shingles.

Talk with your health professional to learn which vaccines are right for you based on your age, health, job, lifestyle and other factors and take steps to stay up to date to make sure you have the best protection from serious disease. We all want to pass on family traditions, a grandmother's quilt, a dad's love of books – but no one wants to pass on a serious illness. Take charge of your health and help protect those around you by asking about vaccines at your next health professional visit.

March Council Minutes



- 1. Minutes and Treasurer's Report of the February 12, 2019 Council Meeting were unanimously approved.
- 2. *Thank you notes* were received from the LMA Lego League for the church's continued support, Becky Furlo for receiving books on the grieving process and Tracy Townsend of UPMC Hamot for receiving prayer squares and knitted items from our Magic Fingers Grace Group.
- 3. St. Matthew's Lutheran Church Financial Assets and Endowment Committee Pastor shared that this will be a five (5) person committee consisting of three (3) people from St. Matthew's, and two (2) from Luther Memorial. The committee will determine how to manage funds which originated with St. Matthew's. Luther Memorial Attorney Tom Tupitza will file paperwork with the Commonwealth to eliminate St. Matthew's 501c(3) status. Luther Memorial member Don Tatar will be assisting as he has considerable church experience with these matters.
- 4. *Staff Relations Committee* Les reported that those serving on this committee are: Lois Smith, Bob Banks, Diane Banks, Lois Fobes, Mark Lechner, Les Fobes (as a convener) and one (1) person from St. Matthew's.
- 5. Berman Bedding Documentation is progressing regarding the lease for the parking lot.
- 6. *Emergency Preparedness Committee* Six (6) people have volunteered to help with building security; training will be held for those interested.
 - a. An additional window shade for the nursery has been requested and will be ordered.
 - b. LMA is seeking a product to prevent the classroom doors from opening from the outside without interfering with safe exit.
 - c. The committee is investigating an in-service program on safety. There is a workshop available and the committee will be looking into details.
- Service Opportunities Pastor is considering a committee to speak with others regarding service opportunities.
 ServErie will be taking place on April 6. Dates of opportunities for service will be featured on the table under the powerpoint screen.
- 8. *Property* Chairman Rick Kern reported on the recent completed projects:
 - a. The 5th Floor renovation is complete
 - b. The squirrel-cage fan which once ventilated the plenum has been removed and shelving has been built in the extra space.
 - c. New signage has been installed in the former J. H. Thompson building.

Projects under consideration were presented:

- a. School vestibule heaters to be replaced this summer
- b. Paint & Carpeting for 5th floor hallway estimated at \$6,145
- c. Carpet Replacement Parlor, Sacristy & Hallways estimated total \$23,463
- 9. *Columbarium Expansion* The original columbarium committee contingency plan was that the columbarium fund maintain a sufficient balance to engage a mortuary service to remove cremains and maintain in another location if this would become necessary. After 12 years, 50% of the niches are reserved or in use. Plans are being considered to expand the size of the columbarium by 72 to 200 niches.
- 10. *Parking Lot* Due to the constraints imposed by the cost of required stormwater management work, extensive parking lot reconstruction is not feasible. Less extensive repairs are possible, such as:
 - a. Reconstruction of the 10th St. ramp to ease grade, and the east entrance to the school for safety
 - b. Reversal of traffic flow per plans after further study, including involvement of LMA
 - c. Repair/replace portions of current pavement, seal and restripe entire parking lot
 - These repairs would be at an estimated cost of \$29,283 with \$13,500 additional option for stone entry pillars at 10th Street entrance.




