*"The angel said to Mary, do not be
afraid, for you have found favor with
God." Luke 1:30*

Do not be afraid. These words are some of the most important words from the Bible that I carry around in my head and heart on a daily basis. As I walk on the same road of faith that you do, I can't tell you how often I repeat these four simple and powerful words, but I do know that I say them an awful lot. I say them over and over again when I have one of those hard days of ministry. I say them when I am anxious about a visit to the hospital or a visit with a family going through turmoil. I say "do not be afraid" when the health of someone I love is declining. I say them when I don't feel like getting involved in the life of another person, or a situation that needs my help. I say the words when I am entering into an unfamiliar situation or going to meet new people. I say them when I am uncertain whether family finances will remain steady. I say them on my walks with my dog when I am trying to make sense of the world. I say the words "do not be afraid" when I feel unsteady or uncertain, or whether I will remain steady in doing what is right and faithful.

I say these words as a prayer because they look for help, but also hope that the Lord will move me past my fears into peace. I pray these words again and again because they set my mind on divine things by opening my eyes to my many blessings, and the many ways God has held me up through my life. I know this prayer doesn't remove me from real life stuff, but it does bring me peace in knowing that the Lord is present in my troubles and worries. Fear prevents us from living fully the way that God intends us to live. Fear holds us back from more fully engaging in this world and in the lives of others. I would encourage you to add the words "do not be afraid" to your own prayer life. As we prepare to celebrate the Resurrection of our Lord, we stand together in community giving thanks to God that our greatest fear, death, has been conquered by Jesus! I pray for a blessed season of Easter for us all as the ministry of Luther Memorial Church and Academy.

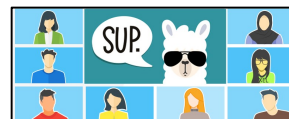
Youth on Zoom

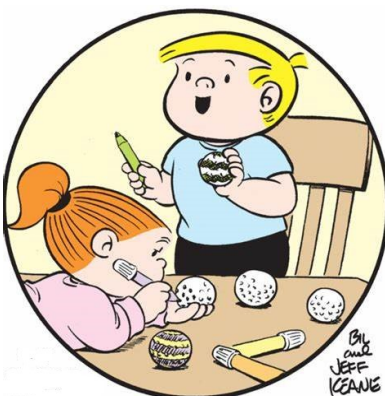

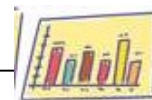

March 2021 Council Meeting via Zoom



1. *Minutes* of the February 9, 2021 meeting were reviewed and on motion unanimously accepted. Minutes of the January 31, 2021 Annual Meeting were unanimously accepted.
2. *Treasurer's Report* - Treasurer Greg Kern reviewed the details of the written report indicating that church finances are healthy. After brief discussion, the report was unanimously approved.
3. *Communications* - Pastor Coleman shared that these are printed in the monthly newsletter.
4. *Worship & Music recommendations for Holy Week & Easter* - The reopening of the building is going well. Suggestion for Easter is to continue as now, with sign-ins, masks and no singing.
 - a. *Easter* - Ushers will help seat people, with attention to side-to-side distancing;
 - b. *Beginning March 14* - Congregation members will be asked to inform the church office if they plan to attend the Easter Sunday service at 8:15am, 10:30am, or online;
 - c. *Palm Sunday* - Pew configuration will change from blocking two pews to blocking every other pew to provide additional seating. On motion, it was unanimous that we follow recommendations from the Worship and Music Committee, as well as organizing ushers to help with socially distant seating on Easter, gathering peoples' attendance plans on Easter, as well as changing pew configuration.
5. *Video Streaming Equipment for Sanctuary* - John Mazza of Levco has integrated our existing equipment and placed new equipment in the choir loft. The service will be carried on You Tube rather than Facebook. A crew is being recruited and will be trained in operating the system. They will manage the equipment during any service which is streamed on YouTube. Transition from Facebook to YouTube will require communication with congregation.
6. *Council Meetings* - On motion, it was unanimous that the May 11 council meeting be held in person and on Zoom. Council members will be asked to lead the opening devotions at monthly meetings. The next Council meeting will be held Tuesday, April 13 at 6:00pm via Zoom.
