St. Lucia Festival Sunday, December 9, 2018 4:00 p.m. Luther Memorial Church



For many, many years Lucia has brought faith, hope, and a reason to believe in good things to come. It is thought that during a time when the rulers of the land did not look favorably upon Christianity, a woman named Lucia had devoted her life to God and the poor. She gave her entire dowry to the poor.

The Festival of St. Lucia begins the Christmas season in Swedish custom. A well-lit ship on Lake Vannern approached the shore carrying a woman at the helm dressed in white with a glow around her head. The maiden, widely believed to be Lucia, distributed food and clothing to the needy, thus endearing herself to the Swedish people. Many families today celebrate St. Lucia in their homes.

Santa Lucia's coming begins the feasting, merriment, singing and the spirit of friendliness and goodwill that lasts all through the holidays. We invite you to join us for this annual event.

Youth and young children participate in this traditional Swedish program. Rehearsals will be held at 11:45am Sunday, December 2 and Sunday, December 9. All participants are asked to be at the church by 3:00pm to prepare for the program on December 9.

Coffee and Swedish refreshments will be served following the program from a table of lighted candles and beautiful Swedish decorations.

Luther Memorial ReCharge



- Luther Memorial Recharge is being offered based on the following observations:
 - The number of people who attend Sunday morning worship continues to stagnate or fall.
 - Sunday morning is filled with many other activities and events. Sunday is no longer the day of rest.
- Integrating an "inquirer of faith" into our Sunday morning worship is difficult. People who don't even know who Jesus is or know very little about the Church could find it difficult to understand what is going on.
- Churches who play around with worship styles thinking that it will "bring people into the church" fail to realize that people are seeking a relationship with Jesus first. Connecting people to Jesus and to one another is what is most important, not the worship style, per se, but the connection that is made to the Word... to Jesus.
- Luther Memorial Church's worship style is very meaningful and we do it very well, and to mess around with what happens on Sunday morning would be foolish and counterproductive. The Lutheran Church has wonderful theology, in that, we believe in the tension between Law and Gospel and the Theology of the Cross. We do not believe in the Prosperity Gospel and there is a deep need to continue doing what we do well.
- An opportunity to worship and connect to Jesus in a smaller community on a late Sunday afternoon could be meaningful and expand Luther Memorial's mission to make disciples.

We are getting great ideas for putting together a Healthy Women curriculum that can be shared among the four (4) conferences. Previously, our Healthy Women event was held in Pleasantville in February. Sometimes it was difficult to get all four (4) conferences to be able to make the trek. So we're going to put together a program that will be shared with everyone and each can have an event in their area. Of course, anyone can go to any W/ELCA event at any time, no matter where you live.

Tracy Heutsche, our Nominating Chair, is going to be looking for the slate of officers for the June Convention. Offices up for grabs are President, Treasurer, Board member from Conference 1 (that's us), and Board member from Conference 4 (the Indiana, PA area). Please prayerfully consider serving, it's a blast!

Convention 2019 will be held June 7-8 at Olmsted Manor. Our program will be "Visitors From the Past" presented by Luella Krieger. Since she is so dynamic and everyone is going to want to be there, there will be no other Saturday workshops. There will be a workshop on Friday evening. So save the date, and plan on joining us!

Lutherlyn Retreat 2019 is looking for a representative from NWPA for the coming September retreat with South West. You would be working with Mary Alice McMunn, Cambridge Springs, and three (3) ladies from South West. It is a 2-year commitment with the second year taking on the responsibility of being the Retreat Chair. No lie, it is a huge responsibility, but it is also a great opportunity to bring faith, song, prayer, and spirituality to a hundred women!

The Human Trafficking presentation on October 24 was a great success. Theresa Flores, our presenter, led a dynamic program about her experiences as a victim of trafficking. We are officially a SOAP charter. We have been given the materials and power points so that we might spread her message, approach hotels and motels, and be the 'boots on the ground' to help bring about awareness. The conference had 38 people attending and we now have one (1) team willing to go out to businesses to share what we know. I have met with Carol Finotti (Crime Victims Center) and Betsy Wiest, SSJ, to collaborate our endeavors.

Our ladies continue to drop soaps off at various rest stops. When speaking with Betsy Wiest, I learned that she is taking data that will be used to support Human Trafficking legislation; recording how many restrooms on the Pennsylvania interstates actually post the help-line posters as they should be – in the stalls and/or by the sinks. They should NOT be in the lobby or by the opening of the restroom doors. The handlers will not let girls/boys in there if they see that the help-line posters are available. If you are interested in being part of the data collection, please see me. You will not be hanging posters or moving what's already there, you will just need to note on a document what you observe. This data is used by Pennsylvania only and only Pennsylvania facilities are counted.

The Conference 1 Gathering was held on October 13 at the Colony Restaurant with 25 participants. A planning committee was organized for the next three (3) years so that there is a staggered membership – as it is supposed to be. Actually, six (6) people volunteered to be on the committee!! WooHoo, that's a first!

Gratitude: 'Tis a Gift to be Thankful



By the time you are reading this, Thanksgiving will be over. But that doesn't mean that the season of thankfulness is over. Christmas is coming, and we continue to be thankful for our blessings. Many people only express their thankfulness or gratitude around these two special holidays, but there is reason to experience and express it on a daily basis. Over the past decade, science has found that practicing gratitude has a positive influence on our mood, outlook, relationships and overall happiness, all of which can buffer against depression

and anxiety.

In one 2008 study, British researchers concluded that gratitude has a strong association with well-being and social functioning, and a person's measure of gratitude can predict life satisfaction. In another study, they also found that people who score higher on gratitude measures tend to sleep better. An analysis of Swiss adults published in the journal, <u>Personality and Individual Differences</u>, linked the "attitude of gratitude" to better physical health in part related to better psychological health.

Practicing gratitude also appears to contribute to promoting resilience. A study in the <u>Journal of Research in Personality</u> (April 2013) connected the roles of gratitude and "grit". Grit was defined as having long term interests and passion and a willingness to push past setbacks in order to progress toward goals. Researchers from George Madison University noted that: Gratefulness helps you to appreciate and seek out the good aspects in life, while grit helps to accept and overcome frustrations. In other words, an attitude of gratitude can help you stay focused on your goals and not let life drag you down.

One of the most powerful and popular tools for cultivating thankfulness is keeping a gratitude journal. Another one that I prefer is to thank God in prayer for what we are grateful for, no matter how small or simple.

I know I am grateful for the wonderful, caring people here at Luther Memorial. Recently after a funeral luncheon a family member, not a LM member, said to me, "your church really knows how to care for a family." This made me feel so proud to be part of such a caring, thoughtful and thankful community. I was smiling so big when I shared this with those who were working and with anyone else who would listen. And smiling is good for us too because we use fewer muscles and less energy to smile than to frown, so why waste the energy frowning. And so I would like to thank all of you who give so much of your time to making Luther Memorial a caring congregation. And I would like to encourage the rest of you to become involved and reap the benefits of giving and receiving gratitude.

On a more serious note, yes, there will be times when we are sad or depressed over various things like the passing of a loved one, the change in a job or financial troubles and that is why we offer the Blue Christmas Service on Wednesday, December 12 at 6:00pm. Bring your problems and offer them up to God and leave feeling thankful for his love and for this community.
