I wanted to say thank you, thank you and thank you, for this past ministry year of 2017. I thank you for your faithful and generous giving, because as

you will read in the annual report, this year was a positive one financially, as well as all the faithful ministry done by this congregation! Please be sure to read through the Annual Report which includes all the details of this past year. We can see what we have done **together** through the wisdom and guidance of God. The Annual Report will be posted to our website and hard copies will be available throughout the building. I am grateful that I am pastor at Luther Memorial Church, and that you are a part of my life.

Next, I wanted to give you updates on Luther Memorial's new sound system and the motel next to the church. First, Church Council recently approved a bid from Levco Communications to install a new sound system in the main church. The purchase of the new sound system has been made possible through a very generous donation. A committee spent a year meeting with several sound companies, asking many questions, comparing bids, and then made a recommendation to council. We anticipate much better sound and hearing, especially through the hearing assist units that will be available to those who need them. Much more information will be shared about the new sound system in the future. The new sound system will be installed by no later than Palm Sunday, March 25.

Second, in regards to the motel property next to the church, Church Council approved a bid for an appraisal to be done on the motel property. As the congregation is aware through a congregational letter, Luther Memorial Church was approached by the motel owner asking if we had any interest in purchasing the motel property. Based on the responses to the letter, enough interest was expressed to get more information, such as what the property would be used for, the value of the property, and financial contributions from congregational members. Please know that at this time we are only gathering information so a good decision can be made.



# **New Blood Pressure Guidelines**



And Exactly "What is the Widow Maker?"

For the first time in 14 years, the American College of Cardiology and the American Heart Association released new blood pressure guidelines. For a long time the goals for blood pressure parameters have been controversial.

Heart disease, which accounts for ¼ of all deaths in the U.S., is the leading cause of death among both men and women. High blood pressure, or hypertension, is second only to smoking as a preventable cause of heart attack and stroke.

Previously, normal BP was in the range of 120/80 and below. The top number is the systolic pressure and refers to the pressure in your arteries as your heart contracts. The bottom number is the diastolic pressure, the pressure in your arteries when the heart relaxes or between heartbeats. Previously, high BP was 140/90. Now, if your BP is 120-129/80 you have an elevated BP. A top number of 130-139 and a bottom number of 80-89 are considered Stage 1 hypertension. Readings greater than 140/90 are Stage 2 hypertension.

This change means 46% of US adults are identified as having high BP, compared with 32% under the previous parameters. You may be thinking, "Oh no, more pills to take!" But the guidelines also emphasize that Doctors need to focus on a whole framework of healthier lifestyle changes for patients.

By catching changes early, people with elevated BP can take steps to achieve healthier numbers through lifestyle changes and interventions, i.e. lose weight, stop smoking, exercise regularly, diet modifications with caffeine and salt limitations, limiting alcohol and stress reduction modalities and most important, keeping track of your BP. You and your Doctor can use a "risk calculator" to determine your risk of heart disease or stroke over the next 10 years. This can be found at <a href="https://www.cvriskcalculator.com">www.cvriskcalculator.com</a>. This assessment, combined with the other recommendations can prompt more thorough doctor-patient conversations to determine whether life style changes alone can help, or if medication may be necessary.

Many of you have heard of the heart attack call the "widow maker". What is it exactly? There are 3 arteries that run over the surface of the heart and supply it with blood. There is 1 artery on the right side called the right coronary artery and 2 on the left side, which is the main side. The left anterior descending, LAD runs down the front of the heart and supplies the front and main wall and the left circumflex supplies the side wall. When the LAD is totally blocked or has a critical blockage it is known as the "widow maker". No one knows who came up with this term, but the reason is likely that if the artery is blocked right at the beginning of its course, then the whole artery goes down which results in the whole front wall of the heart going down. If immediate help and interventions are not done then the consequences are often catastrophic and may lead to death. Fortunately for those that do survive and make it to a medical center where they do interventional cardiology, a stent can be placed to restore circulation. The outlook for patients who experience this is improved if the patient gets help immediately!!

February is "heart month", and I hope this information will help you understand the importance of managing your blood pressure and to get help immediately if you develop the signs of having a heart attack.

So, take care and if you're going to eat chocolate, especially on Valentine's Day, make sure it's dark chocolate.


