### No One Dies Alone



NODA is a national volunteer-centered program that provides companionship and support for dying individuals. It was started by Sandra Clark, RN in 2001 in Eugene, Oregon, when a patient wanted her to stay with him as he was dying. By the time she returned, the patient had died.

The goal of the program is to provide companionship and support for a dying person so that he or she doesn't die alone, but instead, has a dignified death surrounded by caring people.

As a volunteer your role is to:

- Be emotionally/physically present
- Promote dignity and respect of that patient as a person
- ▶ If appropriate read poetry, stories, scripture, and/or play music
- Be a good listener there are no perfect words
- Ask for help if needed

This is a newly established program at UPMC Hamot in collaboration with the Palliative Care and Support Team and the Pastoral Support Services. Hamot often receives patients from the outlying region such as; Warren, Kane, Bradford, and many other areas. Many times families do not have the financial means to travel and/or stay an extended time within the Erie area to be with their loved ones during the dying time. If patients become too unstable to travel back to their home region they often stay at the hospital until the time of their passing. NODA can provide support and companionship for patients and offer relief for families that someone is with their loved one. ### A Migraine Without Pain?



I chose this subject because I have had this happen to me two times. Fortunately I don't get migraines that cause pain. So what is a migraine without pain? It is an optical or ocular migraine that affects your vision.

Typically a migraine is a recurring type of headache that can cause moderate to severe pain. It can be accompanied by other symptoms such as nausea, weakness and sensitivity to light and sound. An optical

migraine occurs without head pain or nausea and is a form of silent migraine. It is characterized by a variety of vision disturbances that can appear in one or both eyes such as:

- a temporary loss of partial or complete vision in one or both eyes;
- seeing spots;
- seeing zig-zags;
- flashes of light or double vision.

Migraine sufferers might recognize these vision symptoms as an aura phenomenon that occasionally serves as a warning sign that migraine pain is coming.

An optical migraine has no headache that follows. The vision symptoms usually resolve themselves within 20-30 minutes. But, if it lasts longer or becomes worse, call your doctor or go to the emergency room. They are thought to originate in similar ways to other migraines in that irregular electrical activity occurs in the brain. Some other causes may be:

- genetics;
- gender-women more commonly have them;
- MSG- which is in some foodsk
- changes in weatherk
- stress;
- harsh lights.

There is hope for women as they age because they might have fewer headaches, less pain but more auras.

Ocular migraines themselves aren't harmful but other medical conditions can cause vision disturbances so if this is a new problem, you should inform your doctor. If eye and heart problems are ruled out, people can think about ocular migraines as a temporary inconvenience. The articles I read stated the over the counter magnesium can help ocular migraines and auras in general and this is a simple remedy that may help. But as usual, check with your health care provider before taking it. I didn't realize that magnesium may help this problem till I did research for this article.
