#### **POVERTY, UNEMPLOYMENT & MEDIAN INCOME** ARE MEASURES of ERIE'S OVERALL ECONOMIC **HEALTH & NEED FOR SOCIAL SUPPORTS** According to Erie Vital Signs (www.erievitalsigns.org): In 2013-17 -Median household income in Erie County was \$48,200 (down from \$53,900 in 2000)... Median household income in City of Erie was \$35,800 (down from \$41,800 in 2000) \*17% of Erie County residents had incomes below the poverty level (up 5% points since 2000) \*27% of City of Erie residents had incomes below the poverty level (up 8% points since 2000) \*25% of children under 18 in Erie County lived below the poverty line (**up 9% points** since 2000) \*39% of children under 18 in the City of Erie lived below the poverty line (up 12% points since 2000)... ...higher than the state (19%) and the nation (20%) In 2017, unemployment rate in Erie County was 5.8% ...higher than state (4.9%) and the nation (4.4%) In 2017, unemployment rate in City of Erie was 6.4% ...(up 1.5% points since 2000)... 2020 Theme: They Showed Us Unusual Kindness (Acts 28:2)

WEEK OF PRAYER FOR

"Malta, an island in the Mediterranean Sea, received the Christian faith through the efforts of the Apostle Paul after he was shipwrecked there while travelling to Rome. In Acts 27 and 28, we read the detailed narrative describing the terrible storm at sea, the 'providential' shipwreck and subsequent welcome afforded to the 276 individuals on the vessel who all made it safely to shore. Paul's healing ministry in Malta is also briefly described in the same New Testament text.

Today many people are facing the same terrors on the same seas. The very same places named in the reading also feature in the stories of modern-day migrants. In other parts of the world many others are making equally dangerous journeys by land and sea to escape natural disasters, warfare and poverty. Their lives, too, are at the mercy of immense and coldly indifferent forces - not only natural, but political, economic and human. This human indifference takes the indifference of various forms: those who sell places on unseaworthy vessels to desperate people; the indifference of the decision not to send out rescue boats; and the indifference of turning migrant ships away. As Christians, do we show unusual kindness?"

Each year, the Week of Prayer for Christian Unity is a time for Christians throughout the world to gather and raise their voices, hands and hearts to God seeking the fulfillment of the prayer of Jesus, the Son of God, "that they all may be one."

The traditional period in the northern hemisphere for the Week of Prayer for Christian Unity is January 18 - 25. Those dates were proposed in 1908 by Paul Wattson to cover the days between the feasts of St. Peter and St. Paul, and therefore have symbolic significance.

Resources for the 2020 Week of Prayer have been written by Christians from the Mediterranean islands of Malta and Gozo.

Please feel free to reflect upon the following scriptures privately or for group discussions during the week of prayer, being mindful that by doing so, you will be in prayer with others all around the world.

Daily Scripture and Prayer Guide for Week of Prayer

Day 1: Reconciliation: Throwing the Cargo Overboard (Acts 27: 18-19, 21; Psalm 85; Luke 18: 9-14)

Day 2: Enlightenment: Seeking and Showing Forth Christ's Light (Acts 27:20; Psalm 119: 105-110; Mark 4: 35-41)

<u>Day 3:</u> Hope: Paul's Message (Acts 27: 22, 34; Psalm 27; Matthew 11: 28-30) <u>Day 4</u>: Trust: Do Not Be Afraid, Believe (Acts 27: 23-26; Psalm 56; Luke 12: 22-34)

Day 5: Strength: Breaking Bread for the Journey (Acts 27: 33-36; Psalm 77; Matthew 6:34)

Day 6: Hospitality: Show Unusual Kindness (Acts 28: 1-2, 7; Psalm 46; Luke 14: 12-24)

Day 7: Conversion: Changing Our Hearts and Minds (Acts 28: 3-6; Psalm 119: 137-144; Matthew 18: 1-6)

Day 8: Generosity: Receiving and Giving (Acts 28: 8-10; Psalm 103: 1-5; Matthew 10: 7-8)
