#### Chaos or Community: A Look from Inside......

In 1967 Dr. Martin Luther King Jr. wrote his final book before his death, <u>Where Do We</u> <u>Go from Here: Chaos or Community?</u> It was written amid the backdrop of a changing America in which old norms were being torn down and a new era seemed to be in formation. From this turmoil, a new Phoenix was arising from the ashes fomented by racism, sectionalism, classism, injustice and inequality. All those things that kept this magnificent bird from taking flight were being thrown from the overloaded cargo area that was so weighted that flight could not occur.

This was the launching pad from which seemed to be the culmination of Amos' prophecy, "But let justice roll on like a river, righteousness like a never-failing stream." It seemed as if the Christian community would become a vibrant participant and a proponent of this banner.

This community or chaos theme is not much different from what followed after the trial of Christ where religious leaders believed that they were serving the community because of their definitive roles as the perpetual overseers of religious thought and adherence. In other words, community consisted of a staunch set of rules that became the progenitor of the chaos that soon ensued. It's rather ironic that out of those pre-set conditions conducive to chaos arose the foundations of the beloved community.

If we move forward to today's scenario, it is one that seems to remind us of the old. Do the decisions we make on a personal level as Christians and on a collective level as the Church lead us to the fork in the road where the two paths are labeled "community" and the other "chaos"? And more importantly, which path do we take?

It is my belief that the Church is at a crucial period in its history. Will it stand as the lighthouse on the hill that gives light to all or will it be the salt that has lost its savor and is trodden underfoot. We must stand as the church triumphant or become the church decimated. Decimation cannot be an alternative because *"upon this rock I will build my Church and the gates of hell shall not prevail against it."* 

In one of the most crucial times in our nation's history, President Lincoln spoke these words, "Sir, my concern is not whether God is on our side; my greatest concern is to be on God's side, for God is always right." Individually and collectively, what does it mean to be on God's side? I believe that we are admonished by the word of God not to be merely hearers of the word but more so...doers. For if any are hearers of the word and not doers, they are like those who look at themselves in a mirror; for they look at themselves and, on going away, immediately forget what they were like. But those who look into the perfect law, the law of liberty, and persevere, being not hearers who forget but doers who act – they will be blessed in their doing. (James 1: 22-25)

#### Greater Erie Area Habitat for Humanity Summer 2019 Faith Build

This summer marks the 10<sup>th</sup> Anniversary of the Habitat summer 'faith' builds. During that time, church volunteers have built nine new houses and renovated two others, all of which have become homes for families in our area.

This summer's build begins in early June. It is being called: **"The House that Courage Built."** As we did last year, the 'Courage' house will be a rehab, taking an existing home and adding another bedroom and bathroom to accommodate the family involved.

Because this is a somewhat smaller project, there won't be quite as many volunteer slots available. Work will begin on Tuesday, June 4<sup>th</sup> and conclude on Saturday, June 22<sup>nd</sup>. We will work Tuesday through Saturday each of those three weeks. During week 1, volunteers will work a full day (7:30 am to 4:30 pm). During weeks 2 and 3, volunteers will work just a half day (7:30 am to noon), with the exception of both Saturdays, which are again full-day slots.
