Christianity is about transformation. It's about resurrection. It's about peace, love, grace, mercy, forgiveness and joy. Joy in the gift we have received and then share with others. I see the way you interact with one another and the stranger, and it makes me very proud to be pastor of this church. I want you to feel confident in welcoming and inviting the stranger, and I believe that you can continue to do this. For those people in your life who are searching for a faith community, reach out to them, and walk with them into this place so we can welcome them.

In his book titled "The Reason for God", author Timothy Keller writes: "Christian theology speaks of the seriously flawed character of real Christians. A central message of the Bible is that we can only have a relationship with God by sheer grace. Growth in character and changes in behavior occur in a gradual process after a person becomes a Christian. The mistaken believe that a person must "clean up" his or her own life in order to merit God's presence is not Christianity. As the saying has it, the church is a hospital of sinners, not a museum for saints."

#### Wear a Green Ribbon



May is Mental Health month and was created by Mental Health America over 50 years ago to raise awareness about mental health conditions and the importance of mental wellness. Yes, 50 years ago! That's a long time ago! As a nurse I am aware of mental illness and did a three (3) month rotation in Psychiatric Nursing at Gowanda State Hospital in Gowanda, New York. I have to admit, back then, this was my least favorite part of my nursing education. Why has it taken so long to acknowledge and bring awareness to mental health

problems, especially in children and adolescents? It can happen to any family, and does, including my own family. Years ago having a mental health problem in the family was embarrassing or even shameful. Fortunately with more awareness that stigma is not felt as strongly.

The number of families who are affected by mental, emotional and behavior disorders in young people is staggering. It is estimated that one (1) in five (5) children or adolescents may have a mental health problem that can be identified and treated. Young people can have mental and emotional problems that are very real, painful and costly. These problems are a source of stress for the child as well as the family, school and society at large. Mental health disorders in children and adolescents are caused by biology, environment or a mix of both. Some biological factors may be genetics, chemical imbalances, and damage to the central nervous system. Environmental factors may include exposure to violence, extreme stress, bullying, toxic substances, or the death of a loved one. These may be hard to identify so when changes are noticed a complete physical, including blood work should be done by their family doctor. There are physical conditions that can cause depression, i.e. endocrine disorders like hypothyroidism. Many times children don't know how to express themselves when they don't feel well.

Of course, most of us realize that the impact of social media on our children and adolescents is less than desirable. This situation needs to be closely monitored starting at a young age.

Nutrition in children, adolescents and adults is coming to the forefront as a possible cause of mental health problems, especially depression. Our brains and bodies need the nutrients of a whole foods diet. This does not include processed foods, fast foods, or high sugar foods which includes most cereals and drinks. They won't be happy with changes in diet, but it is worth trying if it will help them.

Tragically, an estimated two-thirds of all young people with mental health problems aren't getting the help they need. Among children aged 5-18, suicidal thoughts and attempts led to more than 1.1 million ER visits in the U.S. in 2015. Yes, 5 years old! And this may only catch a small percentage of the kids. Why the increase? It could be greater recognition by parents, schools and doctors. Kids may also be under more stress and develop depression at a high rate. The experts say this has to be addressed as a public health problem. It is not normal and is not a "phase". Suicide has to be taken seriously.

So what can you do? Maintain communication with your children. Observe them for different or unusual behaviors, i.e. what kind of music are they listening to? Take them to the doctor regularly or if there is a change. Educate yourself about the signs of depression and warning signs of suicidal thoughts. A big challenge for adults is to let the youth talk about the problem rather than jumping in to "fix" it. It is better to give them permission to talk about their concerns before they act on them in self-destructive ways.

The Mental Health Ministries pamphlet on Mental Illness in Children and Adolescents says: "People with mental problems are our neighbors. They are members of our congregations, member of our families; they are everywhere in this country. If we ignore their cries for help, we will be continuing to participate in the anguish from which those cries for help come. A problem of this magnitude will not go away. Because it will not go away, and because of our spiritual commitments, we are compelled to take action." (Rosalynn Carter)

The first week of May is Children's Mental Health Week. Let's wear green to raise awareness!

#### **April Council Minutes**

1. *Minutes and Treasurer's Report* of the March 12, 2019 Council Meeting were reviewed and unanimously approved.



- 2. *Rick Kern* presented property proposals and plans:
  - a. Vestibule heaters at three (3) outside doors in the LMA building are scheduled to be replaced during the summer. A proposal from Connecto Electric was submitted in the amount of \$8,890.
  - b. The 10th Street ramp will be replaced.
  - c. Reconstruction of east entrance to parking lot at school involving new traffic flow for parking lot. Decision was one entrance off 10<sup>th</sup> Street, and two exits onto 11<sup>th</sup> Street. Potential problem of buses blocking view on 11<sup>th</sup> street was reviewed. We agreed to: reconstruct north concrete entrance ramp & sidewalk, reconstruct east LMA entrance and sidewalk, remove and replace crumbled asphalt, seal entire parking lot, restripe parking lot spaces, and install signage to direct new traffic flow. Postponed was construction of 2 stone pillars (3' x 3') at 10<sup>th</sup> Street entrance, replacing parlor carpeting and some furniture, and redoing upstairs hallways.
    - i. Pastor Coleman moved that we accept proposal for wall heaters as well as construction part of parking lot (not including the pillars), proposed at \$30,500 and draw funding from LM Foundation and as needed, the Luther Memorial endowment. Motion passed unanimously.
  - 3. St. Matthew's Financial Assets and Endowment committee members are Jean McMillan, John Evans, Doug Werle, (all St. Matthews) Casey Hedlund, Don Tatar (Luther Memorial). Barb Chaffee moved that Council approve formation of the St. Matthews Foundation Committee for the purpose of disbursing funds to people/organizations in need, that the Committee report to Luther Memorial Church Council its recommendations of the committee structure and how funds will be disbursed from the St. Matthew's Foundation Account, and that recommendations for disbursement from the St. Matthew's Foundation account will come from the St. Matthew's Foundation Committee to Luther Memorial Church Council as a recommendation for approval. Motion passed unanimously.
  - 4. Lease with Berman Bedding was presented to Council for review and vote at a future meeting.
  - 5. *Staff Relations Committee* members are (Les Fobes convener), Lois Fobes, Lois Smith, Bob Banks, Diane Banks, Mark Lechner, Pam Masiroff, Becky Carullo.
  - 6. *Emergency Practices Task Force* reported on security issues:
    - a. A security shade has been purchased and installed for the nursery.
    - b. New locks for classroom doors were considered for \$5,227.10, but further research is needed to find a less expensive solution. Our insurance carrier will be contacted to see if they have any expertise or recommendations.
    - c. Numerous training options, for LMA and safety ministers, are under consideration. Nine people have volunteered as Safety Ministers. Procedures will be developed. Disaster Plan examples have been received from several Lutheran churches. A Walk-thru is planned with Rick Kern and committee members of the inside and outside of the building.
  - 7. *Mother/Daughter Banquet* Les requested council men to volunteer to help.
  - 8. *Luther Memorial Beach Service* The service this year will be cancelled as it falls on Pentecost Sunday. Members are asked to attend the ELP beach service on August 11.
  - 9. Next Meeting Scheduled for Tuesday, May 14 at 7:00pm.




