Luther Memorial ReCharge



Luther Memorial Recharge is being offered based on the following observations:

- The number of people who attend Sunday morning worship continues to stagnate or fall.
- Sunday morning is filled with many other activities and events. Sunday is no longer the day of rest.
- Integrating an "inquirer of faith" into our Sunday morning worship is difficult. People who don't even know who Jesus is or know very little about the Church could find it difficult to understand what is going on.
- Churches who play around with worship styles thinking that it will "bring people into the church" fail to realize that people are seeking a relationship with Jesus first. Connecting people to Jesus and to one another is what is most important, not the worship style, per se, but the connection that is made to the Word... to Jesus.
- Luther Memorial Church's worship style is very meaningful and we do it very well, and to mess around with what happens on Sunday morning would be foolish and counterproductive. The Lutheran Church has wonderful theology, in that, we believe in the tension between Law and Gospel and the Theology of the Cross. We do not believe in the Prosperity Gospel and there is a deep need to continue doing what we do well.
- An opportunity to worship and connect to Jesus in a smaller community on a late Sunday afternoon could be meaningful and expand Luther Memorial's mission to make disciples.

Liturgical Dance at Luther Memorial Church



Grace Petron is a member of Luther Memorial church and is currently a senior at Mercyhurst University studying dance and liturgical dance. As part of a class to earn her minor in liturgical dance, Grace will be conducting a research project during the month of October within our 10:30 worship services. The aspects of this project will not be a permanent part of Luther Memorial's normal liturgy. The purpose of this research is to identify where and how often within the service is best to place dance that will most benefit

the congregation. During this project Grace will be leading two adult spiritual growth classes on October 7 and 14. During those classes she will be discussing what liturgical dance is, the benefits it brings, the history behind it, the potential problems it poses, and the controversy that it has within the church. She will propose challenging and engaging questions for adults of all ages. Throughout the worship services in October, dancers from the Mercyhurst University Liturgical Dance Ensemble will participate in different aspects of the liturgy. On October 14, the dancers will also perform a piece of original choreography during the Second Sunday Friends & Family event before the service at 10:15am. At the end of the project, on Reformation Sunday, Grace will be conducting a survey. The questions on this survey will center on the congregation's feelings regarding the different aspects of the dance during the liturgy. This survey is specifically for those who wish to participate; no one will be forced to include their opinion if they do not want to. This project will enhance Grace's education on dancing within the church by giving her additional tools to further develop liturgical dance that can be utilized more often in a variety of churches, denominations, and styles of worship.

Labels



Well that isn't a very exciting title! But it is important when it comes to food labels. The FDA had ordered that new nutrition labels be developed and the label was approved in 2016. But, as we all know, things don't happen quickly with government programs. So, it was just this July that the new label made its debut!

The old labels had small print and were difficult to read. So let's start at the top and address the changes that have been made.

- The first line states how many servings per container.
- Then the serving size is listed in bold print and this has <u>increased</u> from 1/2 cup to 2/3 cup per serving.
- Total Fat is now in bold and bigger print. Saturated Fat and Trans Fats are still listed under it.
- Cholesterol has moved up to the next line.
- Sodium is listed next.
- Total Carbohydrates are next with Dietary Fiber and Total Sugars following. The next line is the big change; "Includes Added Sugars" in grams and percentage are now specifically listed.
- Protein is then listed.
- Vitamin A and C have been eliminated. Vitamin D, Calcium, Iron and Potassium have replaced them.
- The statement about the % of Daily Value remains, but they eliminated the graph of Total Fats, Cholesterol, Sodium, Total Carbs and Dietary Fiber for a 2,000 and 2,500 calorie diet.

I want to address the biggest change which is the "added sugars" listing. Sugars are carbohydrates that are found in fruit and milk and some vegetables. They either occur naturally or are added to food during processing. Added sugars are those that are used in the cooking or processing of a food item to change its flavor. Added sugars go by many different names like maltose, dextrose, high fructose corn syrup, agave syrup, cane syrup, and corn syrup. Even "fruit concentrate" is an added sugar. The Federal CDC recommends that added sugars should be kept to less than 10 percent of our daily diet.

So how do you track added sugars? All naturally occurring sugars don't count toward the total. This is good news! If you eat a piece of fresh fruit that may contain 17 grams of sugar you have eaten ZERO grams of added sugars. Artificial sweeteners also do not factor in the added sugar count.

Not all food products have the nutritional label. They may just have the ingredients, their amounts and percentage listed. So you will have to read them carefully. The higher up added sugars are listed, the greater percentage of added sugars is in the product.

Also remember these amounts are per serving size. The new label has also increased the liquid serving size from 8 ounces to 12 ounces. Many of the energy drink cans are actually 2 servings; therefore you are drinking twice the number of added sugars when you drink the whole can. Most of those drinks have little or no nutritional value.

Reading labels and being conscientious about what we eat has many benefits. Doing this will decrease the incidence of dementia, Alzheimer's, and Parkinson's disease. Also, the risk of heart disease, stroke and cancer will be decreased along with arthritis and rheumatic diseases. Longevity and vitality will be increased and weight management and control of blood sugars and lipids will be improved.

I have placed print outs of what the new labels look like and they can be found on the table by the school library door.

I also want to extend a warm welcome to the St. Matthew's members. Please feel free to contact me if you have any questions about the Care and Health Ministry program here at Luther. We, Jan MacInnes and I, offer programs like the OWL's, the knitting program and the prayer group. I can also help with health concerns, questions, visitations, and I take blood pressures the third Sunday of every month.

I personally love the fall season and all the delicious foods it brings to our plates. But, I also am careful of the amount of added sugars I eat and this has helped me lower my fasting blood sugar, maintain a steady weight and feel better! Here's to healthy eating!



- ➤ The tuition will either be deducted from your checking account, savings account, or charged to a credit card. If the credit card option is chosen, you will be responsible for a 4% fee.
- ➤ The authorization form was included in your tuition letter for 2018/2019. This form was to be returned to the school office before June 15.
- Parents have the option of making tuition payments over a 10 or 12 month period.
