## Christian Education for the Ministry Year 2018 and 2019



Luther Memorial Church partners with parents and grandparents to raise ethical and moral children. Parents and grandparents do so much to raise good and well balanced kids by providing them with so many life opportunities and experiences. One of the most important ways to raise ethical and moral children is to teach them the Word of God, which will plant seeds of faith and teach our children to be moral young men and women. Luther Memorial Church provides an excellent Christian Education program *to partner* with parents and grandparents in this endeavor, and are encouraged to stay

connected through the below opportunities.

- **Children's Church** begins on Sunday, September 16 during the 10:30am worship service. Children's Church is for kids age 4 and goes through 6<sup>th</sup> grade. This is a wonderful ministry for our children. Also, the church nursery is available for children 6 months to 3 years old. Finally, please remember that Pastor Coleman provides a Children's Sermon each Sunday.
- **Confirmation** begins on Sunday, September 9 by participating in the **"God's Work. Our Hands"** service project and continues on Sunday, September 23 when confirmation students participate in the CROP Walk held at Presque Isle State Park (Beach 1) at 1:30 pm. See details below:

• Integrating an "inquirer of faith" into our Sunday morning worship is difficult. People who don't even know who Jesus is or know very little about the Church could find it difficult to understand what is going on.

- Churches who play around with worship styles thinking that it will "bring people into the church" fail to realize that people are seeking a relationship with Jesus first. Connecting people to Jesus and to one another is what is most important, not the worship style, per se, but the connection that is made to the Word... to Jesus.
- Luther Memorial Church's worship style is very meaningful and we do it very well, and to mess around with what happens on Sunday morning would be foolish and counterproductive. The Lutheran Church has wonderful theology, in that, we believe in the tension between Law and Gospel and the Theology of the Cross. We do not believe in the Prosperity Gospel and there is a deep need to continue doing what we do well.
- An opportunity to worship and connect to Jesus in a smaller community on a late Sunday afternoon could be meaningful and expand Luther Memorial's mission to make disciples.

# Ice or Heat?



Which One Should I Use?

I have asked myself this question and have also been asked this question by others many times. I found an infographic from the Cleveland Clinic that explains the problem, the condition and the solution in an easy to understand format. So, I thought I would pass this information on to all of you.

• **Strains** - Pulled muscles or injured tendons in back, arms or legs. **Ice** eases inflammation (redness, swelling, and/or tenderness) and numbs pain. **Heat** eases stiffness AFTER inflammation resolves.

- **Sprains** Stretching or tearing of ligaments in joints like the knee, ankle, foot, elbow, etc. **Ice** eases inflammation and numbs pain. **Heat** relieves stiffness AFTER inflammation resolves.
- **Tendonitis** Acute irritation after activity in tendons attached to joints like the shoulder, elbow, knee, wrist, heel, etc. **Ice** eases inflammation and numbs pan.
- **Tendinosis** Chronic irritation and stiffness in tendons attached to joints. **Heat** relieves stiffness after inflammation resolves.
- Headache Pain from nerves or blood vessels in the head or from muscles in the neck. Ice numbs throbbing head pain. Moist Heat relaxes painful neck spasms.
- Arthritis Worn-away cartilage in joints (knee, shoulder, elbow, fingers, etc.) Moist Heat eases chronically stiff joints, relaxes tight muscles.
- **Gout Flare Ups** Chronic, inflammatory arthritis (big toe, instep, ankle, heel, knee, wrist, fingers, elbow, etc.) **Ice** calms flare-ups, and numbs the pain.

Why use ice for injuries less than 6 weeks old? Ice constricts blood vessels, which numbs pain, relieves inflammation and limits bruising.

Why use heat for arthritis and injuries more than 6 weeks old? Heat increases blood flow, which relaxes tight muscles and relieves aching joints.

An important fact: **Do not use heat for acute injuries. It increases inflammation and can delay healing.** Ice and heat are easy, natural and affordable ways to relieve pain and are part of alternative care medical practices.

I would also like to pass on that some changes have been made regarding the frequency of taking acetaminophen (extra strength Tylenol 500 mg). For many years the bottles read that the recommended dosage was 2 tablets every 4 hours for pain. Now the recommendations are 2 tablets or 1000mgs every **6-8 hours** as needed for pain and not to exceed more than 3000-4000 mgs per 24 hours. Acetaminophen is metabolized in the liver as are many other medications, and too much of it can cause liver damage. I have not heard publically about these changes and only became aware of them because my sister recently incurred some injuries and Urgicare told her to take the ES Tylenol every 8 hours. I thought this wasn't adequate pain management and that she could take it more often. But after she checked with her son-in-law, who is a surgeon, he informed her of the changes. So I looked at the bottles I have at home and found that one brand recommended every 6 hours and the other every 8 hours. So, as with all medical questions, be sure to ask your health care provider.
