Luther Memorial ReCharge - Sunday, September 8

Luther Memorial Recharge is being offered based on the following observations:

- The number of people who attend Sunday morning worship continues to stagnate or fall.
- Sunday morning is filled with many other activities and events. Sunday is no longer the day of rest.
- Integrating an "inquirer of faith" into our Sunday morning worship is difficult. People who don't even know who Jesus is or know very little about the Church could find it difficult to understand what is going on.
- Churches who play around with worship styles thinking that it will "bring people into the church" fail to realize that people are seeking a relationship with Jesus first. Connecting people to Jesus and to one another is what is most important, not the worship style, per se, but the connection that is made to the Word... to Jesus.
- Luther Memorial Church's worship style is very meaningful and we do it very well, and to mess around with what happens on Sunday morning would be foolish and counterproductive. The Lutheran Church has wonderful theology, in that, we believe in the tension between Law and Gospel and the Theology of the Cross. We do not believe in the Prosperity Gospel and there is a deep need to continue doing what we do well.
- An opportunity to worship and connect to Jesus in a smaller community on a late Sunday afternoon could be meaningful and expand Luther Memorial's mission to make disciples.

Christian Education for the Ministry Year 2019 and 2020

Luther Memorial Church partners with parents and grandparents to raise ethical and moral children. Parents and grandparents do so much to raise good and well balanced kids by providing them with many life opportunities and experiences. One of the most important ways to raise ethical and moral children is to teach them the Word of God, which will plant seeds of faith and teach our children to be moral young men and women. Luther Memorial Church provides an excellent Christian Education program to partner with parents and grandparents in this endeavor, and are encouraged to stay connected through the below opportunities.

- Children's Church (Rally Day) begins on Sunday, September 15 during the 10:30am worship service. Children's Church is for kids age 4 and goes through 6th grade. This is a wonderful ministry for our children. Also, the church nursery is available for children 6 months to 3 years old. Bach Cantata Vespers



September is Prostate Cancer Awareness Month



Blue is the color of the month. I wrote a newsletter article about prostate cancer in 2015 and feel the need to update this important subject.

Prostate cancer is the most common non-skin cancer in America, and the 4th most common tumor diagnosed worldwide. It now affects 1 in 9 men. Previously it affected 1 in 7 men. One new case occurs every 3 minutes, previously it was 2.4 minutes, and a man dies from prostate cancer every 19.1, now 17 minutes. I could not find information as to why this number has decreased. For men of African descent, 1 in 6 will develop this disease. It is estimated that 4 million American men are living with prostate cancer. A man is 35% more likely to be diagnosed with prostate cancer than a woman is to be diagnosed with breast cancer! "Men don't die from prostate cancer" is what most people think. Well, this is not totally true. Yes, if it is caught early enough and treated, then men can "live with it" and sometimes be "cured". The secret is early detection as 99% of patients live 5 years or longer after diagnosis. Unfortunately some men don't like to take the time to obtain medical care. My late husband was one of those men. Consequently and unfortunately when he was diagnosed with prostate cancer, it was too late and it had metastasized to many parts of his body. Please read this article and share it with anyone and everyone you know, especially the men in your lives.

The prostate gland is a part of the endocrine system. It is a walnut-sized gland that sits below the bladder and in front of the rectum at the bottom of the pelvis. Only men have prostate glands. In rare cases prostate cancer can cause symptoms. These symptoms involve the genitourinary tract but may also cause rectal pressure and pain or stiffness in the lower back, hips, pelvis or thighs.

It is generally accepted that there is a genetic link that increases the risk of prostate cancer (PC). The fathers, brothers and sons of men with PC are twice as likely to develop this disease. In many respects, PC and breast cancer are considered to be a related disease. There is now evidence of a hereditary link between PC and breast cancer in women and vice versa in men. This genetic link makes it wise for a man diagnosed with prostate cancer or a woman with a history of breast cancer to advise their direct relatives (sons and daughters, sisters and brothers) to undertake early and adequate screening for prostate and breast cancer. This high risk may be due to genetic factors (known or unknown), shared lifestyle factors or other family traits. So men, don't bury your head in the sand. If your doctor doesn't ask, be sure to tell him/her if there is a family history of PC or breast cancer in your family and get checked!

Getting checked is as simple as getting a blood test called a PSA (prostate specific antigen) and getting a digital rectal exam. Yes, these may be uncomfortable, but they also can be life-saving. If the results are abnormal an MRI, ultrasound, bone scan and biopsy will be needed to determine if it has spread from the prostate to other parts of the body. Researchers are continuously working on improving the tests to diagnose this disease. Please take the time to take care of your health.

So, what can you do to help prevent this disease? Here are 10 health tips from the Prostate Cancer Foundation website:

- 1. Eat fewer calories and exercise more so that you maintain a healthy weight. Drink water and natural juices instead of soft drinks. Cancer likes sugar.
- 2. Avoid smoking for many reasons. Consume alcohol in moderation, if at all.
- 3. Avoid taking more than 1500 mg of calcium per day. Skip the supplements and consume your calcium from leafy green vegetables, beans and fish..
- 4. Eat more fish. Evidence from several studies suggests that fish can help protect against prostate cancer because they contain "good fat", particularly omega-3 fatty acids.
- 5. A lack of vegetables in the diet is a risk factor for prostate cancer. Cruciferous vegetables such as cauliflower and broccoli are especially beneficial. Use olive oil for cooking for a maximum health benefit. Tomatoes cooked in olive oil have shown to be beneficial. Also soy and green tea may be helpful.
- 6. Avoid over-supplementation with mega-vitamins. Too many vitamins, especially folate, may "fuel the cancer" and while a multivitamin is not likely to be harmful, if you follow a healthy diet with lots of fruits, vegetables, whole grains, fish and healthy oils, you likely won't even need a multivitamin. Ask your health care provider about herbal supplements. Some may even be harmful.

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- 7. When barbecuing, marinate meat and turn it frequently to prevent charring. Charred meat of any type can produce carcinogens.
- 8. Regular exercise is important. Research now suggests that exercise may be one of the best natural antioxidants, eliminating inflammatory molecules that drive cancer.
- 9. Relax and enjoy life. Reducing stress in the work place and home will improve your survivorship and lead to a longer happier life.
- 10. While eating well and exercising may make a difference in the long run, it doesn't always eliminate your risk of having prostate cancer. Talk to your doctor and get a screening done.

Nutrition and wellness go hand-in-hand. Taking control of what you put into your body is a great first step toward reducing your risk for prostate cancer, and other dangerous diseases.

Treatment depends on the stage of the cancer. How fast the cancer grows and how different it is from surrounding tissue help determine the stage. There are many treatment options that may include watchful waiting, surgery, radiation therapy, hormone therapy, chemotherapy or participating in a research study. Please don't hesitate to get a second opinion at a teaching medical center.

So, again, I say this disease affects the whole family. Men talk to your fathers, siblings, and sons. Women do the same. Education is how we will decrease the incidence of this disease. There are many websites available for information and support.

Thank you for this opportunity to educate all of you on this disease that affected my whole family.

School tuition payments are processed by Vanco Services, a company endorsed by Thrivent Financial, for the 2019/2020 school year. The cost for this service is paid by the school, which is much better than the \$36 fee charged to each family by the FACTS program.

- The tuition will either be deducted from your checking account, savings account, or charged to a credit card. If the credit card option is chosen, you will be responsible for a 4% fee.
- ➤ Parents have the option of making tuition payments over a 10 or 12 month period.

Payments

MILK MONEY: 2% chocolate or white milk is available each day. The first semester milk money payment will be due in August. You are welcome to pay by semester for a discounted rate of \$36 per student or yearly, \$70 per student. The cost per carton is 50 cents.
