Legend of Santa Lucia

According to legend, Lucia was a medieval saint who carried food and drink to hungry folk in the province of Värmland during a period of famine. She was seen across Lake Vänern, with her white gown and crown of lights, so today's costume uses the same gown and crown.



The Lucia legend is said to have originated in Syracuse on the island of Sicily.

A young girl, about to be a bride, gave her entire dowry to the poor of her village and admitted she had become a Christian. She was accused of witchcraft and burned at the stake on December 13, 304 A.D.

Much later in history, the early church declared her a Saint, Santa Lucia.

Italian artists sometimes picture her as a blind girl holding a lamp.

There are many legends but in each one, Lucia stands for the symbol of light and hope to all mankind.

Santa Lucia's coming begins the feasting, merriment, singing and the spirit of friendliness and goodwill that lasts all through the holidays.






