


HOMILY Pastor Jay



All are invited to the meal. If you would like to participate but not to receive the bread and wine, please cross your arms in front of you for a blessing from the pastor.







This hymn was not originally associated with communion, but rather was a gathering song for secret meetings of African slaves who had been forbidden their accustomed use of drums or horn for this purpose. After the Civil War the first two stanzas were added and it came to be used as a communion hymn.



The author of today's text, Omer Westendorf, is the author of many hymns in use today.


He is also celebrated for publishing The Peoples Mass Book, which with its use of the vernacular implemented the liturgical reforms developed by Vatican Council II.
