#### Christ our Passover Pascha nostrum

1 Corinthians 5:7–8; Romans 6:9–11; 1 Corinthians 15:20–22

#### Alleluia.

Christ our Passover has been sacrificed for us; \* therefore let us keep the feast, Not with the old leaven, the leaven of malice and evil, \* but with the unleavened bread of sincerity and truth. Alleluia. Christ being raised from the dead will never die again; \* death no longer has dominion over him. The death that he died, he died to sin, once for all; \* but the life he lives, he lives to God. So also consider yourselves dead to sin, \* and alive to God in Jesus Christ our Lord. Alleluia. Christ has been raised from the dead, \* the first fruits of those who have fallen asleep. For since by a man came death, \* by a man has come also the resurrection of the dead. For as in Adam all die, \* so also in Christ shall all be made alive. Alleluia.

### Psalm 150 Laudate Dominum

Hallelujah!
Praise God in his holy temple; \*
praise him in the firmament of his power.
Praise him for his mighty acts; \*
praise him for his excellent greatness.

Praise him with the blast of the ram's-horn; \* **Praise him with lyre and harp.**

## The Lessons

**First Lesson** Hosea 5: 15 – 6:6 (NRSV) <sup>15</sup> I will return again to my place until they acknowledge their guilt and seek my face. In their distress they will beg my favor:

6 "Come, let us return to the LORD; for it is he who has torn, and he will heal us; he has struck down, and he will bind us up.

<sup>2</sup>After two days he will revive us; on the third day he will raise us up, that we may live before him. <sup>3</sup>Let us know, let us press on to know the LORD; his appearing is as sure as the dawn; he will come to us like the showers, like the spring rains that water the earth." <sup>4</sup>What shall I do with you, O Ephraim? What shall I do with you, O Judah? Your love is like a morning cloud, like the dew that goes away early. <sup>5</sup>Therefore I have hewn them by the prophets, I have killed them by the words of my mouth, and my<sup>[a]</sup> judgment goes forth as the light. <sup>6</sup>For I desire steadfast love and not sacrifice, the knowledge of God rather than burnt offerings.

### Second Lesson 2 John 1-6 (NRSV)

<sup>1</sup>The elder to the elect lady and her children, whom I love in the truth, and not only I but also all who know the truth, <sup>2</sup>because of the truth that abides in us and will be with us forever: <sup>3</sup>Grace, mercy, and peace will be with us from God the Father and from<sup>[a]</sup> Jesus Christ, the Father's Son, in truth and love. <sup>4</sup>I was overjoyed to find some of your children walking in the truth, just as we have been commanded by the Father. <sup>5</sup>But now, dear lady, I ask you, not as though I were writing you a new commandment, but one we have had from the beginning, let us love one another. <sup>6</sup>And this is love, that we walk according to his commandments; this is the commandment just as you have heard it from the beginning—you must walk in it.
