CHILDREN'S SERMON – "The Prayer of Jesus" (10:30 am Service)

## WORD - "God speaks to us in Scripture reading, preaching and song."

In the days between Jesus' ascension and Pentecost, Peter oversees the process whereby one of the members of the community of believers is chosen to be the twelfth apostle, in order to fill the vacancy created by Judas's treachery and death.

## FIRST READING: Acts 1:15-17, 21-26

<sup>15</sup>In those days Peter stood up among the believers (together the crowd numbered about one hundred twenty persons) and said, <sup>16</sup>"Friends, the scripture had to be fulfilled, which the Holy Spirit through David foretold concerning Judas, who became a guide for those who arrested Jesus—<sup>17</sup> for he was numbered among us and was allotted his share in this ministry." <sup>21</sup>So one of the men who have accompanied us during all the time that the Lord Jesus went in and out among us, <sup>22</sup>beginning from the baptism of John until the day when he was taken up from us—one of these must become a witness with us to his resurrection." <sup>23</sup>So they proposed two, Joseph called Barsabbas, who was also known as Justus, and Matthias. <sup>24</sup>Then they prayed and said, "Lord, you know everyone's heart. ## Congregational Meeting on Sunday, May 30, 2021 at 11:45 AM

On August 12, 2018, we met as a congregation to vote on the purchase of the adjacent motel property. We presented a plan for the property as well. After a positive vote for purchase of the motel property, the motel owner decided not to sell the motel property. But recently, the motel owner reached back out to us to ask if we would still like to purchase the motel property. The Motel Committee began meeting and presented a plan to Church Council for purchase at a Council Meeting held on Monday, May 3, 2021. Luther Memorial's Church Council voted to proceed with the purchase of the motel property. The final step is for the congregation of Luther Memorial Church to vote on the purchase which will happen at a Congregational Meeting on Sunday, May 30, 2021 at 11:45 am in the Main Church. This meeting will be held in person only with no online option.

## Plan and Proposal for the Resumption of Congregational Singing

The following is the plan for the resumption of congregational singing in Luther Memorial worship services. The most notable updated guidance from the CDC was given on Tuesday, April 27. Much of it was prompted by the significant increase in the number of vaccinated adults in the U.S. population. Of particular interest was their statement that "fully vaccinated people can participate in some indoor events safely, without much risk." For those masked & vaccinated, this includes:

- Attend a full-capacity worship service
- Sing in an indoor chorus

The approved plan by Church Council for the Luther Memorial congregation:

- 1. Resumption of congregational singing to begin on Pentecost Sunday (May 23, 2021).
- 2. Continue with all other current protocols unchanged (i.e. use of masks, seating in designated pews, attendance sign-in to facilitate contact tracing if necessary, etc.)
- 3. Windows in the nave will be open to increase ventilation.
- 4. Sing selected portions of the liturgy (e.g. Kyrie, Sanctus and Lamb of God).
- 5. Four hymns will usually be sung (i.e. Entrance, Hymn of the Day, Distribution and Sending).
- 6. Sing a reduced number of hymn verses (e.g. often first and last verses only).
- 7. During a transition period (possibly all summer) the organ/choir recordings will continue to be used because:
  - a. We expect the number of people attending in-person will remain smaller than pre-pandemic, but will gradually increase.
  - b. The singing will be moderate and cautious and require support of the current recorded choir.
- 8. The choir (or a subset thereof) may resume rehearsals and begin a limited amount of singing (e.g. psalm, anthem) in church sometime during the summer.

#### Worship

At Luther Memorial Church we are thankful that we are able to provide at home communion. Understanding that the bread and wine is a sustaining gift from Jesus that is blessed and received in community, we now have available bread and wine in individual packets that, after being blessed on Sunday morning during our worship, will be available for those worshipping from home to pick up at the church during the week. The intention is that you take home enough bread and wine for each member of your family for the month. During our worship service, those worshipping from home would set before them the consecrated bread and wine, and then receive the bread and wine during worship.
