CHILDREN'S SERMON - "The Empty Tomb" posted to Facebook and YouTube Channel

WORD - "God speaks to us in Scripture reading, preaching and song."

Peter crosses the immense religious and social boundary that separates Jews from Gentiles in order to proclaim the good news of Jesus' life, death, and resurrection, so that God's forgiveness in Jesus' name would reach out to all people.

FIRST READING: Acts 10:34-43

³⁴Peter began to speak to [the people]: "I truly understand that God shows no partiality, ³⁵but in every nation anyone who fears him and does what is right is acceptable to him. ³⁶You know the message he sent to the people of Israel, preaching peace by Jesus Christ—he is Lord of all. ³⁷That message spread throughout Judea, beginning in Galilee after the baptism that John announced: ³⁸how God anointed Jesus of Nazareth with the Holy Spirit and with power; how he went about doing good and healing all who were oppressed by the devil, for God was with him. ³⁹We are witnesses to all that he did both in Judea and in Jerusalem. They put him to death by hanging him on a tree; ⁴⁰but God raised him on the third day and allowed him to appear, ⁴¹not to all the people but to us who were chosen by God as witnesses, and who ate and drank with him after he rose from the dead. ⁴²He commanded us to preach to the people and to testify that he is the one ordained by God as judge of the living and the dead. ⁴³All the prophets testify about him that everyone who believes in him receives forgiveness of sins through his name."

¹Now I would remind you, brothers and sisters, of the good news that I proclaimed to you, which you in turn received, in which also you stand, ²through which also you are being saved, if you hold firmly to the message that I proclaimed to you—unless you have come to believe in vain.

³For I handed on to you as of first importance what I in turn had received: that Christ died for our sins in accordance with the scriptures, ⁴and that he was buried, and that he was raised on the third day in accordance with the scriptures, ⁵and that he appeared to Cephas, then to the twelve. ⁶Then he appeared to more than five hundred brothers and sisters at one time, most of whom are still alive, though some have died. ⁷Then he appeared to James, then to all the apostles. ⁸Last of all, as to one untimely born, he appeared also to me. ⁹For I am the least of the apostles, unfit to be called an apostle, because I persecuted the church of God. ¹⁰But by the grace of God I am what I am, and his grace toward me has not been in vain. 



In Person Worship and In Person Ministry Activities

Luther Memorial Church has re-opened our building for **worship and ministry activities** (following all health and safety protocols as done previously). Sunday services are held in person at 8:15am and 10:30am in the main church. The 10:30am service will continue to be offered on Facebook live and will also be available to watch on Luther Memorial Church's YouTube channel and church website at www.luthermemorialonline.org at 12:00 noon or any time after.

From our Cantor

We thank the members of the choir and other instrumentalists who have faithfully prepared and recorded hymns, psalms and the sung liturgy from their homes for the past year. Please know that this was a "labor of love and dedication" to our worshiping community. A big part of singing in a choir or playing in an ensemble is the satisfaction and enjoyment one receives by being part of a group making music together. In this case, each individual had to not only work, prepare and sing or play in isolation, but also learn new tools and technologies - without the satisfaction of hearing and blending with other voices around them.

Each of them felt it was important to continue singing, giving voice to our faith during these trying times and providing a degree of familiarity and normalcy to the Luther Memorial family through music - one of our great strengths and heritage. If you have found their efforts meaningful and enriching, please let them know your appreciation via a note or phone call.

Our "virtual choir" will continue to prepare hymns and other music for use in our services. We have previously refrained from using recorded music in our services, believing that live offerings represent our "best" offerings. However, we are thankful for technologies that provide this temporary compromise, allowing us to safely and wisely continue to offer up our music as best we can. Almost all of our choir members have by now been vaccinated against COVID-19. As this becomes widespread in our community, I expect we will soon be able to sing together within our worship services.

Worship

At Luther Memorial Church we are thankful that we are able to provide at home communion. Understanding that the bread and wine is a sustaining gift from Jesus that is blessed and received in community, we now have available bread and wine in individual packets that, after being blessed on Sunday morning during our worship, will be available for those worshipping from home to pick up at the church during the week. The intention is that you take home enough bread and wine for each member of your family for the month.
