#### Worship

Our prelude begins at 10:25 each week and flows into the 10:30am worship time. We hope that this will draw us together and into our time of worship. Please remember to be mindful of those around you and those worshiping at home by keeping conversations and visiting to the lobbies once the prelude has begun. Thank you.

A reminder that our livestream runs from the beginning of the prelude through the end of the postlude. To maintain a worshipful space for those joining from home, please remember to leave the chancel area (the area around the altar) clear until after the postlude.

**Lutheran Schools Week** is an annual week of activities and celebration hosted by the Evangelical Lutheran Education Association. This year it runs from March 3 through March 9. A worship service will be held Monday, March 4 at 1:00pm in our main church with Bishop Michael Lozano preaching. All are welcome to attend.

#### **Worship Matters**

**Notice something different?** Yes, our worship spaces are more bare in this season. The Fast of Lent is not just for one sense, but for all of our senses. This is the time to parr away everything that distracts us from our relationship with God. This is the season of repentance. As such, we have simplified the physical worship spaces to focus more clearly on the cross—the sign of God's ultimate power in ultimate weakness for our salvation. We also are using a setting of the liturgy that is simpler (even if newer to some of our ears) than others. Based on *Service Book and Hymnal* Setting II and *Lutheran Book of Worship* Setting III, *Evangelical Lutheran Worship* Setting V is in plainsong chant. It also sets several of our central worship texts to music. You will hear Pastor Jay chant the *Verba* or the Words of Institution—those words that make Communion Communion. We will also share in chanting the Lord's Prayer together. Again, by setting these texts to music, our focus is drawn to these life saving words that draw us deeper into our relationship with God and one another. We will again sing out with the fullness of heart and voice at the Resurrection Feast of the Lamb!

First Holy Communion will be offered on Sunday, April 14, 2024 during the 10:30am service. In preparation for First Communion two Saturday morning sessions will be held on April 6 and April 13 from 9:00am – 12:00 noon, including snack time. These 2 All-Family Workshops will be our preparation for the big celebration! Any family interested in First Communion should plan to attend both sessions. First Communion is open to all the baptized so any child and family are welcome if you're ready. #### **Readings and Commemorations This Week**

**February 18 – Martin Luther, renewer of the church, 1546** – Isaiah 55:6-11; Psalm 46; Galatians 2:16-21; John 15:1-11 -- Though he began his adult church life as a simple Augustinian monk, Luther challenged the abuses he saw in the church, and his work eventually led to the Protestant Reformation. Luther's accomplishments included liturgical reform, translation of the Bible, and creation of the Small and Large Catechisms.
