Gluten-free wafers are available for those who need them; please let the pastor know.


Receive the bread in your open palm, then hold your cup steady for the assisting minister to fill.





Worship Matters

Psalms serve as the first written songs used by the people of God for worship and for devotion. There are, of course, 150 psalms in the book of Psalm but there are numerous other psalms throughout the Bible. This morning we encounter perhaps the most widely known psalm...the 23rd. In whatever translation of the text you know best, this psalm is quite familiar. Indeed, it is—besides the Magnificat—the most widely used piece of scripture in our hymnody. This morning we sing several versions of the 23rd Psalm in worship: *My Shepherd You Supply My Need* is a translation and metricalization (making it singable to a hymn tune with rhythm and rhyme) by Isaac Watts and sung to a traditional North American tune. Additionally, we sing *The King of Love My Shepherd Is* which uses imagery inspired by both Psalm 23 and the Sacrament of the Altar. If you would like to read through some other hymns based on Psalm 23, pick up the red *Evangelical Lutheran Worship* (the primary worship resource of the ELCA) and read through hymns: 778, *The Lord's My Shepherd* and 780, *Shepherd Me, O God*.

- **April 23 Toyohiko Kagawa, renewer of society, 1960** Hosea 2:1'8-23; Psalm 94:1-14; Romans 12:9-21; Luke 6:20-36 Born in Kobe, Japan, Kagawa was orphaned as a young child. Later, when he became Christian, he was disowned by the rest of his family. Wishing to bring Christian principles into society, he worked among poor people, established schools and hospitals, and worked for peace.
