



Then he shall offer it before the FIRE OF SINAI and make atonement on her behalf and she shall be restored. This is the teaching for the woman who gives birth to a female or male. If she cannot afford a sheep, she shall take two turtledoves and two pigeons, one for a burnt offering and the second for a sin offering; and the priest shall make atonement on her behalf, and she shall be restored.

GOSPEL: Luke 2:22-38

Glory to you, O Lord.

Now when the days of their purification were fulfilled according to the teaching of Moses, they brought Jesus up to Jerusalem to present him to the Holy One: As it is written in the teaching of the Sovereign God, "Every male who opens the womb [as firstborn] shall be called holy to the Sovereign God." So they offered a sacrifice according to what is stated in the teaching of the Holy One, "A pair of turtledoves or two young pigeons." Now there was a man in Jerusalem whose name was Simeon; this man was righteous and devout, waiting to welcome the consolation of Israel, and the Holy Spirit, she rested on him. It had been revealed to him by the Holy Spirit that he would not see death before he had seen the Messiah of the Most High God. Led by the Spirit, Simeon came into the temple. When the parents brought in the children Jesus, to do for him what was customary under that which was taught, Simeon took him in his arms and praised God saying, "You release now your slave in peace, Master, according to your word; for my eyes have seen your salvation, which you have prepared in the presence of all peoples, a light for revelation to the Gentiles and for glory to your people Israel." And the child's mother and father were amazed at what was being said about him. Then Simeon blessed them and said to his mother Mary, "This child is set for the falling and the rising of many in Israel, and to be a sign provoking contention; also, your own soul a sword will pierce so that the true hearts of many will be revealed." There was also a prophet, Anna the daughter of Phanuel, of the tribe of Asher. She was of a great age, having lived with her husband seven years after her marriage, then as a widow to the age of eighty-four. She never left the temple but worshiped there with fasting and prayer night and day. At that moment she came and began to praise God, and to speak about the child to all who were looking for the redemption of Jerusalem."

All joys remain, unshadowed light pervading. No valued deed will ever be undone.



Receive the bread in your open palm, then hold your cup steady for the assisting minister to fill.


As you return by the side aisles, please place your empty cup in the tray.



In recognition of Scout Sunday, members of Scout Troop 104G and Pack 352 will be taking part in our service this morning. We thank these young people for serving this morning and wish them the best as they continue to develop lifelong skills offered in scouting.

Today's Events

"Souper" Bowl Tasting event will be held in fellowship hall following the 10:30 service this morning. A variety of "heart-warming" soups are available for tasting. And maybe some recipes will be shared as well. Thank you to our Congregational Life Committee for planning this fellowship time.

Greeting cards can be found in the information rack located near the parlor area. A large variety of cards that will fit every occasion are available. Youth are offering these cards for \$1 each or 6 for \$5. Proceeds will benefit our youth.

Worship Matters

During the Season after Epiphany, we are using the *Nunc Dimittis* (Latin: "Now dismiss") as our **Post-Communion Canticle**. This Gospel Canticle is the Song of Simeon, which the prophet sings while holding the child Jesus at the Purification in the Temple. Martin Luther added this canticle to the Communion service because, he explained, just like Simeon held the child Jesus in the Temple, in Communion we too hold Jesus in our hands. So, like Simeon, we can sing in prophecy, proclamation, and praise.

The Presentation of Our Lord is the official end of the Christmas season. Forty days after Christmas, we remember that Jesus was brought to the Temple to be dedicated and Mary and Joseph came to be purified after his birth. It is also traditionally the day of Candlemas celebrating Jesus as the Light that Simeon prophesies about in his Song ("A Light to reveal to you the nations.") As such, today we light candles and celebrate the light even as we still experience the cold and dark of winter and we bless our Assisting Ministers and Communion Assistants who serve at Luther who, with their very hands and hearts and voices, praise and share Jesus with us.

Worship

Our prelude begins at 10:25 each week and flows into the 10:30am worship time. We hope that this will draw us together and into our time of worship. Please remember to be mindful of those around you and those worshiping at home by keeping conversations and visiting to the lobbies once the prelude has begun. Thank you.

A reminder that our livestream runs from the beginning of the prelude through the end of the postlude. To maintain a worshipful space for those joining from home, please remember to leave the chancel area (the area around the altar) clear until after the postlude.

Ash Wednesday worship services will be held in our main church on February 14 at 10:00am and 7:00pm. Ashes will also be given throughout the day for those who would like them.

Christian Education

First Holy Communion will be offered on Sunday, April 14, 2024 during the 10:30am service. In preparation for First Communion two Saturday morning sessions will be held on April 6 and April 13 from 9:00am – 12:00 noon, including snack time. These 2 All-Family Workshops will be our preparation for the big celebration! Any family interested in First Communion should plan to attend both sessions. First Communion is open to all the baptized so any child and family are welcome if you're ready. However, families with children in grades 3-5 are strongly encouraged to participate if your child has not received First Communion yet. Please contact Pastor Jay or the church office if your family will be attending these sessions. Thank you.

Readings and Commemorations This Week

February 5 – The Martyrs of Japan, 1597 – Ezekiel 20:40-42; Psalm 16:5-11; Galatians 2:19-20; Matthew 28:16-20 - Christianity was brought to Japan in the sixteenth century by Jesuit and Franciscan missionaries. The religion was suppressed, however, and in 1597 twenty-six missionaries and converts were crucified. Nevertheless, Christianity survived and later prospered.

February 6 – Psalm 102:12-28; II Kings 8:1-6; Acts 15:36-41

February 7 – Psalm 102:12-28; Job 6:1-13; Mark 3:7-12
