

Peter's sermon, delivered at the home of Cornelius, a Roman army officer, is a summary of the essential message of Christianity: Everyone who believes in Jesus, whose life, death, and resurrection fulfilled the words of the prophets, "receives forgiveness of sins through his name."

FIRST READING: Acts 10:34-43

³⁴Peter began to speak to Cornelius and his household: "I truly understand that God shows no partiality, ³⁵but in every people anyone who is God-fearing and practices righteousness is acceptable to God. ³⁶"You know the message God sent to the people of Israel, preaching peace by Jesus Christ, who is Lord of all. ³⁷That message spread throughout Judea, beginning in Galilee after the baptism that John announced: ³⁸how God anointed Jesus of Nazareth with the Holy Spirit and with power; how Jesus went about doing good and healing all who were oppressed by the devil, for God was with him. ³⁹We are witnesses to all that Jesus did both in Judea and in Jerusalem. They put him to death by hanging him on a tree, ⁴⁰but God raised Jesus on the third day and allowed him to appear, ⁴¹not to all the people but to us who were chosen by God as witnesses and who ate and drank with him after he rose from the dead. ⁴²"Jesus commanded us to preach to the people and to testify that he is the one ordained by God as judge of the living and the dead. ⁴³All the prophets testify about Jesus that everyone who believes in him receives forgiveness of sins through his name."





AFFIRMATION OF BAPTISM

- A St Paul writes, "Do you not know that all of us who were baptized into Christ Jesus were baptized into his death? Therefore we were buried with Christ by baptism into death, so that, just as Christ was raised from the dead by the glory of the Father, so we also might walk in newness of life. For if we have been united with Christ in a death like his, we will certainly be united with him in a resurrection like his. We know that our old self was crucified with Christ so that the body of sin might be destroyed, so we might no longer be enslaved to sin. For whoever has died is freed from sin. But if we died with Christ, we believe that we will also live with him. We know that Christ, being raised from the dead, will never die again; death no longer has dominion over him. The death he died, he died to sin once for all, but the life he lives, he lives to God. So you also must consider yourselves dead to sin and alive to God in Christ Jesus.
- P Dear friends, rejoicing that we have been united with Christ's death and resurrection in baptism, let us give thanks for its gifts:
- **P** Let us pray.

Merciful God, we thank you that you have made us your own by water and the Word in baptism. You have called us to yourself, enlightened us with the gifts of your Spirit, and nourished us in the community of faith. Uphold us and all your servants in the gifts and promises of baptism, and unite the hearts of all whom you have brought to new birth. We ask this in the name of Christ. Amen.

PROFESSION OF FAITH

- P I ask you to profess your faith in Christ Jesus, reject sin, and confess the faith of the church.
- **P** Do you renounce the devil and all the forces that defy God?
- **G** I renounce them.
- P Do you renounce the powers of this world that rebel against God?
- **G** I renounce them.
- **P** Do you renounce the ways of sin that draw you from God?
- **G** I renounce them.

The presiding minister addresses the congregation.

- **P** Do you believe in God the Father?
- **G** I believe in God, the Father almighty, creator of heaven and earth.
- **P** Do you believe in Jesus Christ, the Son of God?
- I believe in Jesus Christ, God's only Son, our Lord, who was conceived by the Holy Spirit, born of the virgin Mary, suffered under Pontius Pilate, was crucified, died, and was buried; he descended to the dead.

 On the third day he rose again; he ascended into heaven, he is seated at the right hand of the Father, and he will come to judge the living and the dead.

- **P** Do you believe in God the Holy Spirit?
- I believe in the Holy Spirit, the holy catholic church, the communion of saints, the forgiveness of sins, the resurrection of the body, and the life everlasting.
- P You have made public profession of your faith. Do you intend to continue in the covenant God made with you in holy baptism:

to live among God's faithful people,

to hear the word of God and share in the Lord's supper,

to proclaim the good news of God in Christ through word and deed,

to serve all people, following the example of Jesus,

and to strive for justice and peace in all the earth?

- **Q** I do, and I ask God to help and guide me.
- People of God, do you promise to support and pray for one another in your life in Christ?
- **Q** We do, and we ask God to help and guide us.
- P Let us pray.

We give you thanks, O God, that through water and the Holy Spirit you give us new birth, cleanse us from sin, and raise us to eternal life. Stir up in your people the gift of your Holy Spirit: the spirit of wisdom and understanding, the spirit of counsel and might, the spirit of knowledge and the fear of the Lord, the spirit of joy in your presence both now and forever.




The author of this hymn text, an English minister and educator, noted that this hymn was intended to illustrate the Christian doctrine of Baptism, but has become popular as an Easter hymn. The hymn tune composer, a 20th century British university professor, organist, and much-decorated musician, is among the most distinguished of modern composers. His compositions number nearly two hundred, the present one having been published in 1904.

If you are not going to receive Holy Communion, but would like to receive a blessing, please come forward with your arms crossed over your chest.


The original text of this hymn is Latin, written between the 4th and 9th centuries. The text was revised in the 16th-17th century, then translated and published in English in 1849.


