
SECOND READING: Ephesians 1:3-14

³Blessed be the God and Father of our Lord Jesus Christ, who has blessed us in Christ with every spiritual blessing in the heavenly places, ⁴just as God chose us in Christ before the foundation of the world that before God we should be holy and blameless in love. ⁵God destined us for adoption as children through Jesus Christ, according to the good pleasure of God's will, ⁶to the praise of God's glorious grace, freely bestowed on us in the Beloved. ⁷In Christ we have redemption through his blood, the forgiveness of our trespasses, according to the riches of God's grace ⁸lavished on us. With all wisdom and insight ⁹God has made known to us the mystery of the divine will, according to God's good pleasure set forth in Christ, ¹⁰as a plan for the fullness of time, to gather up all things in Christ, things in heaven and things on earth. ¹¹In Christ we have also obtained an inheritance, having been destined according to the purpose of the one who accomplishes all things according to divine counsel and will, ¹²so that we, who were the first to set our hope on Christ, might live for the praise of God's glory. ¹³In Christ you also, when you had heard the word of truth, the gospel of your salvation, and had believed in him, were marked with the seal of the promised Holy Spirit; ¹⁴this is the pledge of our inheritance toward redemption as God's own people, to the praise of God's glory.

GOSPEL: Luke 2:22-38

The Holy Gospel according to Luke. Glory to you, O Lord.

²²When the time came for their purification according to the law of Moses, Mary and Joseph brought Jesus up to Jerusalem to present him to the Lord ²³(as it is written in the law of the Lord, "Every firstborn male shall be designated as holy to the Lord"), ²⁴and they offered a sacrifice according to what is stated in the law of the Lord, "a pair of turtledoves or two young pigeons." ²⁵Now there was a man in Jerusalem whose name was Simeon; this man was righteous and devout, looking forward to the consolation of Israel, and the Holy Spirit rested on him. ²⁶It had been revealed to him by the Holy Spirit that he would not see death before he had seen the Lord's Messiah. ²⁷Guided by the Spirit, Simeon came into the temple, and when the parents brought in the child Jesus to do for him what was customary under the law, ²⁸Simeon took Jesus in his arms and praised God, saying, ²⁹"Master, now you are dismissing your servant in peace, according to your word; ³⁰for my eyes have seen your salvation, ³¹which you have prepared in the presence of all peoples, ³²a light for revelation to the gentiles and for glory to your people Israel." ³³And the child's father and mother were amazed at what was being said about him. ³⁴Then Simeon blessed them and said to his mother Mary, "This child is destined for the falling and the rising of many in Israel and to be a sign that will be opposed ³⁵so that the inner thoughts of many will be revealed—and a sword will pierce your own soul, too." ³⁶There was also a prophet, Anna the daughter of Phanuel, of the tribe of Asher. She was of a great age, having lived with her husband seven years after her marriage, ³⁷then as a widow for eighty four years. She never left the temple but worshiped there with fasting

and prayer night and day. ³⁸At that moment she came and began to praise God and to speak about the child to all who were looking for the redemption of Jerusalem.

THE COMMUNION







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Luther Memorial Church and Academy are located on the original and ancestral homelands of the Haudenosaunee, Mississauga, and Erie people. These lands were ceded by the people of the Six Nations on October 22, 1784 in a treaty ratified by the United States Government in 1785 and never ratified by the people of the Six Nations. We gather in this place indebted to these peoples for their forced generosity. While some peoples were successful in resisting assimilation and genocide, and still live on dwindled homelands now, many were absorbed into other peoples, exiled, or annihilated by the United States government for their land. For those who remain and for the land on which we gather, we give thanks to the Creator and to those who have been custodians of this part of Turtle Island since time immemorial. We also wish to recognize and honor all our Indigenous siblings who have and continue to call this land their home.

Our love and sympathy is with the family, friends, and former parishioners of The Rev. Martin M. Roth who died on December 26. A service date has not been scheduled.

This Tuesday, January 6, is The Epiphany of Our Lord, one of the major feast days of the Church and the last of the days of Christmas. The Erie Lutheran Conference will meet for worship and fellowship at Faith Lutheran Church (5414 E Lake Rd.) for worship at 7:00pm. The Very Rev. Dr. John Downey, vicar of St. Stephen's Episcopal Church, Dean Emeritus of St. Paul's Cathedral, and Canon Theologian for the NWPA Episcopal Diocese will preach. There will be festivities after as we burn the Christmas greens. We hope to see you there!

Worship Matters!

Epiphany, the 6th of January, the 12th Day of Christmas, is the last of the major non-moveable feasts in the church year. We may have just started the church year a few weeks ago with the First Sunday in Advent, but after January 6, all the other major moveable feasts do not have a dedicate *date* but move—sometimes quite widely—around the calendar based on the date of Easter.

The date of Easter has been a hot topic for awhile in the Church and the way to find the date each year may be confusing. But the Golden Date of Easter is *always* the first Sunday after the first full moon after the vernal equinox. Then, count back forty days for Ash Wednesday, count forward forty days for Ascension Day and fifty days for Pentecost and then we're off and rolling for the long green season before coming to Christ the King Sunday which is the 34th Sunday of Ordinary Time. Other feasts and festivals—such as the Anunciation (3/25) or the Feast of St. Peter and Paul (6/28) are not moveable either, but they are not considered major feasts of the church year either.

Because it is the last of the non-moveable major feasts of the church year, and since a large portion of the church's life has been spent without Google, it is a tradition to announce the moveable feasts on the Day of Epiphany. Since we will be sharing in worship on the actual day of Epiphany with our siblings of the Erie Lutheran Conference at Faith in Harborcreek, here is the Announcement of the Moveable Feasts:

Know, dear siblings, that, as we have rejoiced at the Nativity of our Lord Jesus Christ, so by leave of God's mercy we announce to you also the joy of his Resurrection, who is our Savior:

On the eighteenth day of February will fall Ash Wednesday, and the beginning of the great fast of Lent.

On the second day of April we will gather around this Table for the celebration of **Maundy Thursday** and our annual commemoration of the institution of Our Lord's Supper and his command to love one another with servant-like love.

On the third day of April will fall **Good Friday**, and the contemplation of our Lord's merciful Passion.

On the fourth day of April, we will gather for the Great Vigil of Easter and the recitation of our Salvation History.

On the fifth day of April we will celebrate with joy **Easter Day**, the Paschal feast of our Lord Jesus Christ, and the commencement of the Week of Sundays, the Great Feast of Eastertide.

On the fourteenth day of May will fall the Ascension of our Lord Jesus Christ.

On the twenty-fourth day of May, the Great Feast of **Pentecost**, and the celebration of the birth of the Church catholic.

On the thirty-first day of May is the Feast of the **Holy Trinity**, and the contemplation of the great mystery of the Godhead.

The twenty-second day of November will see the conclusion of this liturgical year as we celebration the feast of **Christ Jesus, Sovereign of the Universe**.

And on the twenty-ninth day of November, we will begin the Church year again with the celebration of the First Sunday of Advent.

To Jesus Christ who was and is and is to come the ruler of time be all honor and glory forever. Amen.

About the **Bulletin Cover Art:** from the iconographer, Kelly Latimore: *La presentación de Cristo en el templo* is a modern take on the prophets Anna and Simeon meeting the baby Jesus." In this icon notice: Mary is depicted as the Virgen de Guadalupe, a meaningful depiction for our Latinx siblings. Joseph carries two roosters to harken to the two turtledove or young pigeons that impoverished families were permitted to offer as they dedicated their child to God in lieu of the more expensive offers of lambs. Additionally, as with many icons around the nativity of Jesus, note that the crucifix—reminder of Jesus' death—is not far away; a reminder that Christ is born to die for our sake.
