

- When you call for our faith, forgive our unbelief.


 As you prepare our heavenly dwelling, forgive our earthly worries.





GOSPEL: John 6:1-21

¹Jesus went to the other side of the Sea of Galilee, also called the Sea of Tiberias. ²A large crowd kept following him because they saw the signs that he was doing for the sick. ³Jesus went up the mountain and sat down there with his disciples. ⁴Now the Passover, the festival of the Jewish people, was near. ⁵When he looked up and saw a large crowd coming toward him, Jesus said to Philip, "Where are we to buy bread for these people to eat?" ⁶Jesus said this to test Philip, for he himself knew what he was going to do. ⁷Philip answered him, "Two hundred denarii would not buy enough bread for each of them to get a little." 8One of his disciples, Andrew, Simon Peter's brother, said to him, "There is a child here who has five barley loaves and two fish. But what are they among so many people?" ¹⁰Jesus said, "Make the people sit down." Now there was a great deal of grass in the place, so they sat down, about five thousand in all. ¹¹Then Jesus took the loaves, and when he had given thanks he distributed them to those who were seated; so also the fish, as much as they wanted. ¹²When they were satisfied, he told his disciples, "Gather up the fragments left over, so that nothing may be lost." ¹³So they gathered them up, and from the fragments of the five barley loaves, left by those who had eaten, they filled twelve baskets. ¹⁴When the people saw the sign that Jesus had done, they began to say, "This is indeed the prophet who is to come into the world." ¹⁵When Jesus realized that they were about to come and take him by force to make him king, he withdrew again to the mountain by himself. ¹⁶When evening came, his disciples went down to the sea, ¹⁷got into a boat, and started across the sea to Capernaum. It was now dark, and Jesus had not yet come to them. ¹⁸The sea became rough because a strong wind was blowing. ¹⁹When they had rowed about three or four miles, they saw Jesus walking on the sea and coming near the boat, and they were terrified. ²⁰But Jesus said to them, "Here I am; do not be afraid." ²¹Then they wanted to take him into the boat, and immediately the boat reached the land toward which they were going.





This cup is the new covenant in my blood, shed for you and for all people for the forgiveness of sin.


Do this for the remembrance of me.



Worship Matters

Welcome to the "Month of Bread." For the next five weeks, our Gospel lesson will be taken from the sixth chapter of John. Beginning this week with the feeding of the multitude, Jesus will then go on to give his *Bread of Life Discourse*. We will hear aspects of bread, of feeding and sustenance, of grain and food, of flesh and blood through the end of August. This may seem strange, particularly since we *are* in the year of Mark. Why are we hearing from John for so long? Well there's no simple answer to why this discourse has been inserted in the year of Mark except perhaps because Mark is such a short gospel (the shortest at only 16 verses, many of which we have already heard since the beginning of Advent) so we needed John to "bulk up" the readings. Whatever the reason, we should note that John 6 is the closest the gospel of John has to the Lord's Supper. Indeed, in John's version of the Passion it is not the food (bread and wine) that are key to remembering Jesus among us ("do this in remembrance of me.") but rather the washing of feet and servant-like love. Here, though, John takes not just a few verses but one of the longest chapters in the gospel of John to flesh out (pun intended) the idea of Jesus as the food for life. As part of our celebration in these weeks, we will share baked bread from around the world during Communion. For those who are unable to receive such bread, please ask Pastor Jay for a wafer. As we share in "staple food and festive drink," let us again receive Jesus the Bread of Life as food for our journey.

Worship

Our prelude begins at 10:25 each week and flows into the 10:30am worship time. We hope that this will draw us together and into our time of worship. Please remember to be mindful of those around you and those worshiping at home by keeping conversations and visiting to the lobbies once the prelude has begun. Thank you.

A reminder that our livestream runs from the beginning of the prelude through the end of the postlude. To maintain a worshipful space for those joining from home, please remember to leave the chancel area (the area around the altar) clear until after the postlude.

Readings and Commemorations This Week

July 28 – Johann Sebastian Bach, 1750; Heinrich Shutz, 1672; George Frederck Handel, 1759; musicians – II Chronicles 20:20-21; Psalm 106:1-5; Ephesians 5:15-20; Luke 19:37-40 -- These three German-born musicians have done much to enrich the life of the church. Schütz was an early master who focused on settings of biblical texts. Bach wrote over 300 cantatas along with works for organ and instrumental pieces, and has been called the "fifth evangelist" for the way he proclaimed the gospel in music. Handel's great work, Messiah, is a setting of scriptural texts.

July 29 – Mary, Martha, and Lazarus of Bethany – Psalm 36:5-10; Romans 12:9-13; Luke 10:38-42 – Friends of Jesus, Mary and Martha are remembered for the hospitality of their home that they offered him—Martha focused on serving their guest, and Mary on listening to him. Their brother, Lazarus, was raised from the dead as a sign of the greater resurrection to come.

July 31 - Psalm 111; Isaiah 25:6-10a; Mark 6:35-44

August 1 – Psalm 78:23-29; Exodus 12:33-42; I Corinthians 11:17-22
