

They answered, "Into John's baptism." ⁴Paul said, "John baptized with the baptism of repentance, telling the people to believe in the one who was to come after him, that is, in Jesus." ⁵On hearing this, they were baptized in the name of the Lord Jesus. ⁶When Paul had laid his hands on them, the Holy Spirit came upon them, and they spoke in tongues and prophesied, ⁷ altogether there were about twelve of them.



SACRAMENT OF HOLY BAPTISM

- A In those days Jesus came from Nazareth of Galilee and was baptized by John in the Jordan. And just as Jesus was coming up out of the water, he saw the heavens torn apart and the Spirit descending like a dove upon him. And a voice came from the heavens, "You are my Son, the Beloved; with you I am well pleased."
- P Siblings in Christ, as we celebrate Jesus' own baptism and God calling him Beloved, we gather to celebrate the baptism of another beloved of God. God, who is rich in mercy and love, gives us a new birth into a living hope through the sacrament of baptism. By water and the Word God delivers us from sin and death and raises us to new life in Jesus Christ. We are united with all the baptized in the one body of Christ, anointed with the gift of the Holy Spirit, and joined in God's mission for the life of the world.

Please be seated. The sponsor(s) present the candidate for baptism:

P I present Martin Jonathan Gaber to receive the Sacrament of Holy Baptism.

The presiding minister addresses the parent(s):

- P Called by the Holy Spirit, trusting in the grace and love of God, do you desire to have Martin Jonathan baptized into Christ?
- M I do.

As you bring Martin to receive the gift of baptism, you are entrusted with responsibilities: to live with him among God's faithful people, bring him to the word of God and the holy supper, teach him the Lord's Prayer, the Creed, and the Ten Commandments, place in him hands the holy scriptures, and nurture him in faith and prayer, so that he may learn to trust God, proclaim Christ through word and deed, care for others and the world God made, and work for justice and peace. Do you promise to help Martin grow in the Christian faith and life?

 \mathbb{R} Ido.

The presiding minister addresses the sponsor(s):

- P Sponsor(s), do you promise to nurture Martin in the Christian faith as you are empowered by God's Spirit, and to help him live in the covenant of baptism and in communion with the church?
- \mathbb{R} I do.

Please stand as you are able. The presiding minister addresses the congregation:

- People of God, do you promise to support Martin and pray for him in his new life in Christ?
- We do.

PROFESSION OF FAITH

The presiding minister addresses the parent(s) and sponsor(s) of the child.

- P I ask you to profess your faith in Christ Jesus, reject sin, and confess the faith of the church. Do you renounce the devil and all the forces that defy God?
- I renounce them.
- **P** Do you renounce the powers of this world that rebel against God?
- R I renounce them.
- **P** Do you renounce the ways of sin that draw you from God?
- I renounce them.

The presiding minister addresses the parent(s) and sponsor(s) and the congregation.

- **P** Do you believe in God the Father?
- **G** I believe in God, the Father almighty, creator of heaven and earth.
- **P** Do you believe in Jesus Christ, the Son of God?
- I believe in Jesus Christ, God's only Son, our Lord, who was conceived by the Holy Spirit, born of the virgin Mary, suffered under Pontius Pilate, was crucified, died, and was buried; he descended to the dead. On the third day he rose again; he ascended into heaven, he is seated at the right hand of the Father, and he will come to judge the living and the dead.
- **P** Do you believe in God the Holy Spirit?
- **☑** I believe in the Holy Spirit, the holy catholic church, the communion of saints, the forgiveness of sins, the resurrection of the body, and the life everlasting.

THANKSGIVING AT THE FONT

Water may be poured into the font before or during the thanksgiving. At the font, the presiding minister begins the thanksgiving:

- **P** The Lord be with you.
- **And also with you.**
- **P** Let us give thanks to the Lord our God.
- **Q** It is right to give our thanks and praise.
- P We give you thanks, O God, for in the beginning your Spirit moved over the waters and by your Word you created the world, calling forth life in which you took delight. Through the waters of the flood you delivered Noah and his family, and through the sea you led your people Israel from slavery into freedom. At the river your Son was baptized by John and anointed with the Holy Spirit. By the baptism of Jesus' death and resurrection you set us free from the power of sin and death and raise us up to live in you. Pour out your Holy Spirit, the power of your living Word, that those who are washed in the waters of baptism may be given new life. To you be given honor and praise through Jesus Christ our Lord, in the unity of the Holy Spirit, now and forever.
- C Amen.

BAPTISM

The presiding minister baptizes the child. Water is poured on his head, as the presiding minister says:

P Martin Jonathan Gaber, I baptize you in the name of the Father,

Water is poured on his head a second time:

P and of the Son.

Water is poured on his head a third time:

- **P** and of the Holy Spirit.
- **G** Amen.

The presiding minister continues:

P Let us pray.

We give you thanks, O God, that through water and the Holy Spirit you give your children new birth, cleanse them from sin, and raise them to eternal life.

Laying hands on the head of the newly baptized, the minister prays:

P Sustain Martin Jonathan with the gift of your Holy Spirit: the spirit of wisdom and understanding, the spirit of counsel and might, the spirit of knowledge and the fear of the Lord, the spirit of joy in your presence, both now and forever.

C Amen.

The presiding minister marks the sign of the cross on the forehead of the baptized. Oil prepared for this purpose is used. As the sign of the cross is made, the minister says:

- Martin Jonathan, child of God, you have been sealed by the Holy Spirit and marked with the cross of Christ forever.
- Amen.

WELCOME

A lighted candle may be given to a sponsor of the baptized as the pastor says:

P Jesus said, I am the light of the world. Whoever follows me will have the light of life.

The ministers and the baptismal group face the congregation. The pastor leads the congregation in the welcome.

- P Let us welcome Martin, our newest sibling in Christ!
- We welcome you into the body of Christ and into the mission we share: join us in giving thanks and praise to God and bearing God's creative and redeeming word to all the world.

The congregation offers acclamation with applause.

SPRINKLING SONG ELW 304

During the singing of the hymn, the congregation is sprinkled with water in remembrance of their baptisms.







As you return by the side aisles, please place your empty cup in the silver bowl.



Down Galilee's Slow Roadways






