
Welcome to Luther Memorial Church of the Erie Lutheran Parish


A Reading from Exodus 33:12-23

Consider, too, that this nation is your people." ¹⁴The Lord said, "My presence will go with you, and I will give you rest." ¹⁵And Moses said to the Lord, "If your presence will not go, do not bring us up from here. ¹⁶For how shall it be known that I have found favor in your sight, I and your people, unless you go with us? In this way, we shall be distinct, I and your people, from every people on the face of the earth." ¹⁷The Lord said to Moses, "I will also do this thing that you have asked, for you have found favor in my sight, and I know you by name." ¹⁸Moses said, "Please show me your glory." ¹⁹And the Lord said, "I will make all my goodness pass before you and will proclaim before you the name, 'The Lord said, "you cannot see my face, for no one shall see me and live." ²¹And the Lord continued, "See, there is a place by me where you shall stand on the rock, ²²and while my glory passes by I will put you in a cleft of the rock, and I will cover you with my hand until I have passed by; ²³then I will take away my hand, and you shall see my back, but my face shall not be seen."

Most likely this letter is the first written by Paul. Paul gives pastoral encouragement and reassurances to new Christians living in an antagonistic environment. Their commitment of faith, love, and hope makes them a model for other new Christian communities.

A Reading from 1 Thessalonians 1:1-10

¹Paul, Silvanus, and Timothy, To the church of the Thessalonians in God, the Father, and the Lord Jesus Christ: Grace to you and peace. ²We always give thanks to God for all of you and mention you in our prayers, constantly ³remembering before our God and Father your work of faith and labor of love and steadfastness of hope in our Lord Jesus Christ. ⁴For we know, dear family beloved by God, that God has chosen you, ⁵because our message of the gospel came to you not in word only but also in power and in the Holy Spirit and with full conviction; just as you know what kind of persons we proved to be among you for your sake. ⁶And you became imitators of us and of the Lord, for in spite of persecution you received the word with joy from the Holy Spirit, ⁷ so that you became an example to all the believers in Macedonia and in Achaia. ⁸For the word of the Lord has sounded forth from you not only in Macedonia and Achaia but in every place your faith in God has become known, so that we have no need to speak about it. ⁹For the people of those regions report about us what kind of welcome we had among you and how you turned to God **>** from idols to serve a living and true God ¹⁰ and to wait for God's Son from heaven, whom God raised from the dead— Jesus, who rescues us from the coming wrath.







All are invited to the meal. If you would like to participate but not to receive the bread and wine, please cross your arms in front of you for a blessing from the pastor.








WEEKLY READINGS AND COMMEMORATIONS

October 23 – James of Jerusalem, martyr, died around 62 – Acts 15:12-22a; 1 Corinthians 15:1-11; Matthew 13:54-58; Psalm 1 – One of three early-church leaders named James, this man is identified in the New Testament and by a *historian of the time as a brother of Jesus. Scholars are uncertain whether this means a blood brother. He was a leader of the church in Jerusalem.*

October 24 – Psalm 98; Daniel 3:19-30; Revelation 18:21-24

October 25 - Psalm 98; Daniel 6:1-28; Matthew 17:22-27

October 26 – Philipp Nicolai, died 1608; Johann Heermann, died 1647; Paul Gerhardt, died 1676; hymnwriters – II Chronicles 20:20-21; Psalm 96; Ephesians 5:18b-20; Matthew 13:44-52 -- These great hymnwriters all worked in seventeenth-century Germany in times of war and plague. Nicolai, a pastor, lost 1,300 parishioners to plague, 170 in one week. He wrote "O Morning Star, how fair and bright" and "Wake, awake, for night is flying." Heermann's hymns, including "Ah, holy Jesus," often express the emotions of faith. Gerhardt, perhaps the greatest Lutheran hymnwriter, was a pastor in Berlin.

October 27 - Psalm 1; Deuteronomy 9:25-10:5; Titus 2:7-8, 11-15

October 28 -- Simon and Jude, Apostles – Jeremiah 26:1-16; Psalm 11; John 4:1-6; John 14:21-27 -- We know little about these apostles. Simon is listed as "the zealot" or Cananean in New Testament lists. Jude, also called Thaddeus, asked Jesus at the last supper why he had revealed himself to the disciples but not to the world.
