




This Danish hymn came into widespread use in the English-speaking church through the work of the translator. The original author achieved distinction as a poet in Denmark.



Some members of the Thessalonian community, because of their belief in the nearness of Christ's return, had ceased to work, living off the generosity of other members of the community.

The writer of this letter warns them bluntly that if they want to eat, they need to work.

SECOND READING: 2 Thessalonians 3:6-13

⁶Now we command you, beloved, in the name of our Lord Jesus Christ, to keep away from believers who are living in idleness and not according to the tradition that they received from us. ⁷For you yourselves know how you ought to imitate us; we were not idle when we were with you, ⁸and we did not eat anyone's bread without paying for it; but with toil and labor we worked night and day, so that we might not burden any of you. ⁹This was not because we do not have that right, but in order to give you an example to imitate. ¹⁰For even when we were with you, we gave you this command: Anyone unwilling to work should not eat. ¹¹For we hear that some of you are living in idleness, mere busybodies, not doing any work. ¹²Now such persons we command and exhort in the Lord Jesus Christ to do their work quietly and to earn their own living. ¹³Brothers and sisters, do not be weary in doing what is right.



If you are not going to receive Holy Communion, but would like to receive a blessing, please come forward with your arms crossed over your chest.



Today's Events

Children's Church for PreK – grade 6 will meet this morning from 9:30 – 10:15am. Children's Church will meet again on Sunday, December 11 and will continue to gather the second Sunday of each month. Our youth in grades 7 - 12 will continue to gather on the third Sunday of the month.

ReCharge contemporary service will be held today beginning with a delicious Thanksgiving Feast at 4:00pm. And everyone looks forward to the fun games as well. Our worship service will begin at 5:00pm. Please come and join us for a wonderful evening.

Worship

At our service of worship this morning, we receive the Sacrament of Holy Communion through the distribution of the elements blessed at a previous celebration. Our Lay Distributors of Holy Communion were selected by the congregational council, received instruction, and were appointed by Bishop Michael Lozano. They serve this congregation during times of pastoral vacancy so that we may continue to receive communion as Christ's body here at Luther Memorial Church.

The Prelude brings us together for the beginning of our worship service each Sunday morning. Our worship time together concludes when the Postlude is complete. We ask that the chancel area remain unoccupied during these times of music as live video streaming continues through the entire worship service. Thank you.

Stewardship

Ushers come down the center aisle and pass the offering plates through the pews. The offering is brought forward and, with a prayer of dedication, the offering is placed on the altar and the worship service proceeds. We wonder how many have given any thought to what this means. The worship offering is not a budget issue nor is it simply a fund raising effort. Rather, it is a service of love; an opportunity, as a part of our worship of God, to give thanks for the Grace of God that has been poured out to us. Next week, Christ the King Sunday, we will be asked to make a commitment of our intent to continue to respond with our offerings of thanksgiving.
